Building According To The Pattern

All will admit that seamstresses and carpenters need a reliable pattern or blue print to sew or build by. Not only is this true in the physical realm, but is of eternal importance in the spiritual realm. Jeremiah said, "It is not in man that walketh to direct his own steps" (Jeremiah 10:23). Man is not to go out on his own to try to please God, but is to look to God's divine pattern in God's word.

When thinking about building according to God's pattern, remember Moses when he was about to build the tabernacle. He was admonished "to build all things according to the pattern" (Exodus 25:40). The Hebrew writer reminds the New Testament Christians to take heed and build according to the pattern as Moses did in the Old Testament (Hebrews 8:4-5). As Moses followed the instructions of God, we too should heed the instructions God has given to us in His word and "build according to the pattern."

When building according to the pattern, we look to the word of God and continue steadfastly in the things that are either commanded, necessarily inferred, or given to us as am example. Those who follow the same pattern or blue print will produce the same product, but if one alters the pattern or blueprint, the products may be similar, but not alike. In the spiritual realm it is the same way. If we are following the word of God and not altering it in any way, then the way in which we serve God will be the same as the New Testament Christians.

In thinking about this, notice what the pattern is for the worship of the church.

Singing: The church sang (Ephesians 5:19; Colossians 3:16; Hebrews 2:12; 1 Corinthians 14:15; etc.). As we assemble together in worship to God we simply sing as the pattern says. We do not play or perform, but together we lift up our voices in song.

Giving: The church was commanded to give (1 Corinthians 16:2). This giving was to be done when they gathered together on the first day

of the week. Giving was to be as every man prospered, purposed, and was to be given cheerfully (1 Corinthians 16:2; 2 Corinthians 9:6-7).

Prayer: The pattern for worship in the New Testament church involved prayer (Acts 2:42; Hebrews 4:16; Colossians 1:9; Philippians 4:6). Making our requests and petitions to the Lord is to be a continual state of mind and is very much a part of the worship of the New Testament church. The same is true today of a church following the New Testament pattern (1 Thessalonians 5:17).

The Lord's Supper (Communion): The pattern for partaking of the Lord's supper in the New Testament church (1 Corinthains 10:16) and it is to be done on the "first day of the week" (Acts 20:7). It was taken in remembrance of the death of Christ (1 Corinthians 11:23-30). The Lord's death is to be remembered every first day of the week in this memorial supper that He instituted (Luke 22:1,18-20). The Lord's supper is not just a rite that is done on special occasions, or once a quarter or once a year, but every first day of the week.

Preaching: When the church assembled together for worship, the gospel was preached to convict and encourage them (Acts 20:7; 18:11). This again is important for a church that is following the New Testament pattern. Time is not to be spent in politics and social issues, but in "preaching Christ and him crucified" (1 Corinthians 2:2).

There is a pattern for worship in the New Testament church. If it is changed based upon what I want or like, then I fail to be following the pattern of the New Testament church and I am not a part of a New Testament church.

The same could be said of the other patterns concerning the New Testament church; the membership of the church (Acts 2:38, 47; Galatians 3:26-27); the organization of the New Testament church (Acts 14:23; Philippians 1:1; Ephesians 4:11); the name; the foundation; etc. It is important to understand that there is a pattern in the word of God for those that will be New Testament Christians. Resolve to look to the word of God and follow the pattern for New Testament Christianity. Then at the judgement, we can hear the Lord say "well done" or as is said of Moses, he "was faithful" (Hebrews 3:5)

What If God Was Praised Like Football

A friend of mine recently made this comment, "Around here football is a religion!" At first his words sounded like an innocent declaration of the passion and allegiance many of us have for our favorite teams. But after a little reflection, his words seemed to burn a hole in my conscience. Is football our religion?

God adamantly warned His people of the dangers of idolatry (Exodus 20:3-6). Their passion for false gods eventually led to their earthly captivity as well as separation from God (Ezekiel 20:1-32). We may not have wooden figurines on the mantels of our homes, but that does not mean we may not have our idols.

So, how do we know when we may have crossed the line from sport to idolatry? Please consider the follow "what if" scenarios:

- * What if we gave as much money to evangelism and charity as we do to tickets, travel and team merchandise? Jesus said, "Where you treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:25).
- * What if we could name the apostles, judges, and great heroes of faith like we can name our team's starting lineup, reserves, and even recruits? "Whatever things were written before were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the Scriptures might have hope" (Romans 15:4).
- * What if fathers taught their children about the Lord and His works as much as they do about defensive formations or strategies of an offensive? "Fathers bring your children up in the training and admonition of the Lord" (Ephesians 6:4).
- * What if we proudly displayed our love for the Lord as we do our team's logos from our homes and cars? "Praise the Lord all you Gentiles and let all the peoples extol Him" (Romans 15:11).]
- * What if we arrived early and participated in a worship service with the same dedication we have for crowded football stadiums with limited parking, little leg room and no protection from inclement weather? "For I was glad when they said to me, "Let us go to the house of the Lord" (Psalms 122:1).

- * What if we hated Satan and His schemes to conquer souls as much as we do a rival who is threatening to take a game from us? "Be sober because your adversary the devil walks about as roaring lion seeking whom he may devour" (1 Peter 5:8).
- * What if the joy of winning souls and the pain of losing souls matched our passion for winning and losing a football game of which we are not even a participant? "There is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents" (Luke 15:10).

There is nothing inherently sinful about cheering for a favorite team and enjoying a game. However, sports must not take precedence over our duties and responsibilities to the Lord.

The only victory that truly counts has already been won. Jesus conquered death so that we may live in Him (Romans 5:8; 6:3-7). Allow Him to clothe you with His atoning garments (Galatians 3:27; Revelation 7:14) and join His team in fighting against our true enemy (Ephesians 6:10-16).
