Disciple Disputes

Buc Chumbley

One of the things we like to emphasize in trying to convert a lost soul to Christ, is the fact that they will be added to a large loving family. We tell them, that they will never be alone again and that they will always have the support and encouragement from people of like precious faith. Thankfully, that is usually the case. However, there are times when we are faced with the reality that even Christians are not immune from traditions and prejudices that blind us to the truth. To help us deal with those times when our prejudices get in the way of congregational harmony, Acts chapter 11 is offered.

In Acts 10, Peter and some "brethren from Joppa", visit the home of Cornelius a Roman Centurion. There they witnessed the Holy Spirit fall upon him and his household. When Peter realized that the Gentiles were to receive the same blessings in Christ that he and the Jews had received he said, "Can anyone forbid water, that these should not be baptized who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" And he commanded them to be baptized in the name of the Lord." (Acts 10.47-48).

In Acts 11, when Peter made his report back to the saints in Jerusalem that "the Gentiles had also received the word of God." Some of "the circumcision contended with him, saying, 'You went in to uncircumcised men and ate with them!'" (Acts 11.2-3), Their complaint with Peter was not about him teaching the gospel to Gentiles, instead, it was based on a 1500 year tradition which forbid Jews from social contact with Gentiles. Actually, we shouldn't be surprised that Peter was criticized for his dealings with Cornelius, considering it took powerful evidence from God to get Peter to overcome his own prejudices and go to the home of Cornelius in the first place.

It is in Peter's response to the criticism from the Jews that I want to point out. Peter didn't blow his stack and point the finger of accusations at them. He didn't call down fire from heaven to consume these intolerant Jews. Instead, he gave a blow by blow account of exactly what had happened to him. He told them about the vision and the voice from heaven. He told them about

what the angel had told Cornelius and how the Holy Spirit fell on him and his household just as it had on Pentecost. He simply told them what had happened and when faced with this evidence, the Judean saints could do no other thing than to give God the glory for granting repentance to life for the Gentiles.

What lesson do we learn from Acts 11, when brethren are at odds with one another? Don't appeal to the "church traditions," and certainly don't let prejudices get in the way of reason. Instead, get your Bibles out , search the scriptures and "Let God be true and every man a liar."

If baptism is of no importance, **Why** was Cornelius "commanded" by the Apostle Peter to be baptized (Acts 10:48)?

If baptism is not essential, Why did Jesus include it along with "faith" in speaking of those who "shall be saved" in Mark 16:16?

If one becomes a member of the body of Christ without baptism, **Why** did Paul write the Corinthians saying "by one Spirit are we all baptized into one body" (1 Corinthians 12:13)?

If one can call on the name of the Lord for salvation without baptism, **Why** did Ananias command Saul to be "baptized and wash away thy sins, calling on the name of the Lord"? (Acts 22:16).

If baptism is for the remission of sins, to wash away sins, to put one into Christ, a command of God, in order for salvation, etc., **Why** will men refuse to obey God in being baptized?

Paul wrote in Ephesians 1:7: "In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace." Jesus shed His blood to redeem us.

Question: Where did Jesus shed His blood? He shed it when He died on the cross. Paul said we are baptized into His death in Romans 6:3-4. We urge you to humbly submit yourself in obedience to God.
