Having A Happy Home

How tragic it is to see the homes in our day that are far from happy. God instituted the home and it is to be a place of happiness. But homes are falling apart and at an ever alarming rate and many are just not happy in their homes. The answer to these problems may be varied and seem to be very complicated, but we must understand that God intends the marriage relationship and the home to be a place of happiness. The home as God would have is designed to be a loving, warm and caring place of safety, but how can we have a happy home living in a society where the home and marriage relationship is under full attack? I believe that there some necessary ingredients for a home to be happy.

God Must Be First In the Home

God is the institutor of the home and if it is to be happy, then God must be in His place – that is first in the home. Many may think that spouse or children or jobs is what is to be given first place in the home, but God is to be first in every aspect of our lives if they are to be what He wants them to be and that is happy and fulfilling. When God and His will is given first place in the home, then it will help to solve many other problems that normally destroy the happiness of the home. If a home is to be happy then God will be there.

Must Have Communication

The key to understanding and happiness is communication. In any area of life where people are not happy, they will murmur and complain when communication is not what it should be. In the workplace, employee/employer problems often are caused by a lack of communication. In the home it is the same. We cannot assume that everyone knows what I am thinking. Many homes are destroyed because simple lines of communication are stopped. If we are to have a happy home we must major in communication. Peter stressed this when he wrote "Husband, dwell with them according to knowledge, giving honour unto the wife, as unto the weaker vessel, and as being heirs together of the grace of life, that your prayers be not hindered" (1 Peter 3:7). We must have communication in our homes if they are to be happy. There will be differences, but they can only be worked through when there is communication that gives understanding.

Must Have Cooperation and Commitment

In the home there is a place in the family for each one to fill. Husbands, wives and children each have a place that God has given to them. If we are to have a happy home the husband must assume the leadership in the home, but he must not rule as a master of slaves. He is to be the leader and the family is to follow. The example of a shepherd comes to mind. The shepherd will not do things to scatter the sheep, but to secure their safety and to lead them in the right path. A man who is being considered to serve as an elder or shepherd of God's family exhibits this kind of leadership. This kind of leadership will promote happiness and each will understand their need to fulfill their role in the home. The wife in this kind of home will not sinfully seek to take the leadership away from her husband. The home will be united working together as a team. This cooperation will promote happiness in the home. This cooperation begins as families commit to serving God in all things and not just some areas. This kind of home will not just give lip service to God, but exhibit a true daily walk of service and commitment. When cooperation and commitment exists in a home, it will be a home where happiness resides.

Must Have Love

Without love a home will suffer the loss of the great happiness that could be enjoyed. The importance of love is seen when Paul wrote to the Corinthians, "Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, and have not love, I am become as sounding brass, or a tinkling cymbal. And though I have gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries, and all knowledge; and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, and have not love, I am nothing" (1 Corinthians 13:1-3). Without love, our lives will be void of goodness and happiness. The characteristics of love that Paul lists are so important in order for the home to by happy. Notice Paul says that love is longsuffering, kind, is not envious, boastful or proud. Love does not act in an unbecoming way, does not seek its own good, think evil or is easily provoked, "beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things. Love never faileth" (1 Corinthians 13:4-8a). The harsh, bitter, faultfinding spirit and the spirit of a lack of trust that looks for the bad of the other will not be present when love is there. Love is the ingredient in our homes that will eliminate many problems, but it will cause our homes to be a permanent place of happiness as long as love resides in the home.

Yes, we can have a happy home when God is there, and love is present. Love will allow our homes to be open, honest and a place of trust. This will cause us to communicate and commit ourselves to the good and happiness of the home. These attitudes hinge on one's complete surrender of his life to the will of God. And what a joyous and happy home there will be when God reigns in the home. We are all subject to misunderstanding the Bible. No one is infallible. We must study for ourselves and know what we believe. And we cannot afford to turn that over to our favorite preachers, a respected eldership, scholarly professors or brotherhood editors and simply say, "I believe whatever they believe."

You Must Interpret Scripture

Christians have a responsibility and obligation to interpret Scripture for themselves. The Bible is not subject to "private interpretation" (2 Peter 1:20-21) meaning that it means what **God** intended it to mean, instead of being left to the whim of individual readers of the text.

Roman Catholics believe that the Bible means what the Church, speaking through its councils and bishops, says it means. Surely our faith is not to be placed in the hands of fallible men!

Men wrote the Bible, but they were "moved by the Holy Spirit" (2 Peter 1:21). This means they did not insert their private opinions and clever ideas into Scripture.

However, for someone to argue that the Bible needs no interpretation is to deny the obvious. It is impossible to read and comprehend any piece of literature without interpreting the meaning of the words used to convey thoughts and ideas. The Bible is not exempt from this.

This is why we must be diligent in our study of the sacred text. We should use every means available to us in understanding God's revelation. Dictionaries, commentaries, encyclopedias and teachers are useful tools. When all relevant information is examined, we still must draw our own conclusions as to what any particular passage teaches.
