Where The Roses Never Fade

I enjoy watching the Andy Griffith Show (the old black and white episodes with Barney Fife are the best). However, I do remember a color episode when Aunt Bee had dreams of winning a flower contest. Her rose was perfect until Opie accidentally threw a football and snapped it in half. He tried taping it together to keep Aunt Bee from finding out but it wilted. It's glory faded and she was devastated.

Fading Glory

As Christians, however, we are a part of something that never fades. This was not true of the Old Testament system. It had great glory while it lasted, but it is no more--having given way to the New. When Paul wrote Second Corinthians, false teachers were trying to mix new Christianity with the old system of things. Paul stresses that the old has passed away and has been replaced with something better.

To make his point, he reminds them of the time Moses went to the mountain to receive the Ten Commandments. When he returned to the people, his face was glowing. How impressive this must have been for them to see! To keep the people from seeing the glow fade, Moses covered his face with a veil. Paul then says that the old law was glorious, but its glory has faded (3:7-16).Get the point? The glory of the Old faded until it was no more.

Brighter the Way Grows Every Day!

In contrast to the old, Christians live under the New Testament, the teachings of Jesus and His apostles. Its glory grows greater and greater with each day. It doesn't fade (3:18). When we read about Jesus in the New Testament, we see Him in all of His glory. Not only this, but as we strive to live by what we read, a wonderful transformation takes place. We become like Him—from *glory to glory!*

The growth, glory and the excitement only gets better and better each day. It doesn't fade, but culminates with our arrival into heaven, the most glorious place of all. The Bible says, "But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord" (3:18).

Remember this when you see your body fading and growing weaker. The outer man may be fading but the inner man is getting stronger. An older lady once expressed thanks for the lesson, then said, "But I get so discouraged because I go home and try to reflect back on what I have heard and I just can't remember it all." I asked her if she had any wicker baskets at home. She replied, "Yes." I said, "I imagine they get dusty sometimes and you have to wash them." "Yes," she said. Then I replied, "You know as you fill those baskets with water, it runs out. They leak. The baskets don't hold the water but they sure are a lot cleaner." My point? That's the way it is with our frail minds. We may not be able to remember everything, but the word of God is filtering through, cleaning us up and making us more like Jesus. That's glorious!

Granville Tyler was a great man of God, a powerful preacher and wonderful example to little boys like me who listened to him preach years ago. In his final days, I went to visit him. As I looked at his weak frame, a thought hit me: "This man may not be able to recall a number of scripture references in this condition, but he knows Jesus in a way that I long to know Him."

Paul continues this thought in 4:16-18 when he says, "therefore we do not lose heart. Even though our outward man is perishing, yet the inward man is being renewed day by day. For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is working for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory, while we do not look at the things that are seen, but at the things that are not seen. For the things which are seen are temporary but the things which are not seen are eternal."

In the words of a great hymn, "Saved ones gone to be with Jesus, In their robes of white arrayed, Now are waiting for my coming, Where the roses never fade. Here they bloom but for a season, Soon their beauty is decayed; I am going to a city, Where the roses never fade."

How Comforting.

Obedience That Glorifies God

"Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who works in you both to will and to do for His good pleasure" (Philippians 2:12-13). These verses contain several characteristics of obedience that truly glorifies God.

Obedience that glorifies God *imitates Christ's example*. Verse 12 says, "Therefore", to focus our attention on the preceding paragraph. We must possess the humble attitude of Christ (5-8) – His motive for obeying His Father. If we truly humble ourselves before God, we will heed His instructions. Because Jesus glorified Him above all (9-11). If we glorify God through faithful living, we will live with Him in eternal joy.

It is willing, not forced. Recall Paul said to the Philippians, "You have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence" (12). He did not have to stand over them or pull them along. They willingly obeyed God. These Christians were self starters who kept themselves motivated and working. They were following and honoring God, not some man!

Pertains to our salvation. As Paul said, "Work out your own salvation" (12). We should live the way a saved person ought to live. Christians must continually obey without quitting. Obedience is necessary to become a Christian (Romans 6:3-6, 16-18) and to remain faithful (Galatians 3:1; Revelation 2:10). Obedience is essential, not optional, one cannot remain saved without it.

Is personal. "Work out your own salvation" (12). No one can obey for anyone else. That is one of the many follies of infant baptism: one person makes a decision for another, quite unlike what Ananias told Paul: "And now why are you waiting? Arise and be baptized, and wash away your sins, calling on the name of the Lord" (Acts 22:16). When reaching an accountable age, each must make their own decision to follow the Lord. God expects us to see and accept personal responsibilities.

It is with "fear and trembling" (12). Our deep sense of respect for God keeps us motivated to do His will. But we must also "fear" Him in the sense of being afraid to violate His word. "For we know Him who said, 'Vengeance is Mine, I will repay,' says the Lord. And again, 'The Lord shall judge His people.' It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God" (Hebrews 10:30-31). These attitudes animate Christians with a greater sense of seriousness and responsibility about fulfilling their calling to be holy.

Love God enough to do what He says through Scripture – because He's the One who says it! Does your obedience glorify Him?
