# If God Said It, It Matters

We believe the Bible is God's word in written form. God's word, whether oral or written — matters — as far as we are concerned.

But everyone does not share this view. Some do not believe that "all Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be competent, equipped for every good work" (2 Timothy 3:16,17, ESV). They think that when they read the Bible, they are just reading Paul's words, or Isaiah's thoughts, or Peter's writing. We believe that when Paul, Isaiah or Peter wrote that they were not simply creative geniuses, they were men "moved by the Holy Spirit" as they wrote (2 Peter 1:21).

If we believe this, it affects how we receive the words of Scripture. The Thessalonians received apostolic words as the words of God Himself (1 Thessalonians 2:13).

Some people charge us with "bibliolatry" for holding this high view of Scripture. They claim we worship the Bible instead of God. But this charge is ridiculous. We want to please God, and if God has said something to us, we want to heed it. We do not just love a leather-bound book of rules; we love the words of our God! We want to know what he has said to us in Scripture.

This view of the Bible is the fundamental difference between true Christians and other religious people. The Bible is God speaking to us, so everything He says matters.

We believe baptism for the remission of sins matters because Jesus and the apostles taught it. We believe gathering to eat the Lord's Supper on the first day of the week matters because the New Testament writings teach it. It matter to us that the early Christians sang praises and hymns to God without instrumental accompaniment, because this is what we read in the word of God. Simply put, if God said it — it matters!

# Don't Confuse Me With Facts

Sometime ago I saw a little sign in an office upon which was printed the following words: "Don't Confuse Me With Facts! My Mind Is Made Up!" I found it both amusing and provocative. This perfectly describes the attitude of many people concerning religious matters. The prevailing attitude seems to be something like this: "I have been taught a particular doctrine and my mind is settled on this idea and it is not open for further investigation." This attitude assumes that all the facts are in and then shuts the gate solidly forevermore.

In religion, the Word of God is the one and only book of facts. If we are to be pleasing in God's sight, we must constantly seek to know the facts which are so plainly set forth in the Holy Word...even if it upsets cherished beliefs that we have previously entertained. Too many are afraid of having our boats rocked regarding such matters as the soul. If the Word of God "shakes you up," you may be sure, you needed "shaking"!

Jesus, in describing some people in his day: "for the hearts of this people have grown dull. Their ears are hard of hearing, and their eyes they have closed, lest they should see with their eyes and hear with their ears, lest they should understand with their hearts and turn, so that I should heal them" (Matthew 13:15).

Regardless of whether we want to or not, here are some Bible "facts" we need to face. We may choose to ignore these facts now, but we may be sure they are to be faced. If not now, then in judgment!

- We Must Face The Fact Of Death: We read in Hebrews 9:27, "And inasmuch as it is appointed for men to die once and after this comes judgment."
- 2. We Must Face The Fact Of The Judgment: Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 5:10, "For all must appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may be recompensed for his deeds in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad
- 3. We Must Face The Fact That If We Obey Not The Gospel, We Shall Be Lost: In 2 Thessalonians 1:7-9, Paul wrote, "and to give relief to you who are afflicted and to us as well when the Lord Jesus

will be revealed from heaven with His mighty angels in flaming fire, dealing out retribution to those who do not know God and to those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus. These will pay the penalty of eternal destruction, away from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of His power."

My friend, it is possible that these facts disturb you, but this is God's law and you must face it, either now or later. If you wait until the judgment, it will be too late! Let's fact the facts while there is still time and opportunity.

The Jew was to offer his Passover sacrifice at sunset (Deuteronomy 16:6). Whenever he received a person's garment as part of a pledge, he was to "return the pledge to him again when the sun goes down, that he may sleep in his own garment" (Deuteronomy 24:13). In hiring a worker he was told, "Each day you shall give him his wages, and not let the sun go down on it, for he is poor and has set his heart on it" (v.15).

The sun sets by the word of God. "He appointed the moon for seasons: The sun knows its going down" (Psalm 104:19). As long as God allows life on earth there will be a rising and setting of the sun. It is the only sun this world has known. When Adams was in the Garden, he looked at the same sun we gaze at today. It's the same one Noah saw when he viewed a rainbow for the first time, and that Jesus felt as he hung on the cross. Once we are gone, the same sun will be here to set time and sustain life for the next generation. It will be as Solomon said, "One generation passes away, and another generation comes; but the earth abides forever. The sun also rises, and the sun goes down, and hastens to the place where it arose" (Ecclesiastes 1:4,5).

If we're going to obey God we need to do so before

the sun sets...even today! It is a mistake to think that just because the sun dawned this morning that it will do so again. God says, "Do not boast about tomorrow, for you do not know what a day may bring forth" (Proverbs 27:1). The time to live right is today.

Before the sun sets, either on this day or on our earthly life, let us repent of any sin in our life. We may not get another day to make that choice (Acts 24:25). If we haven't obeyed the gospel, let us do so today while we can still act, even if it is at night (Acts 16:33). If we are holding a grudge or seething in anger, let us "not let the sun go down on your wrath, nor give place to the devil" (Ephesians 4:26,27). If we haven't told our family how much we love them, let us do so before the sun sets for we may not get another chance.

The time to walk with faith in and love for God is today. The time to demonstrate a fearless zeal in doing His work is now, while the sun still shines upon us. For the time is coming when it will set for the last time.
