"Be Sure Your Sins Will Find You Out"

In Numbers 32, the tribes of Reuben and Gad requested the land on the east side of the river Jordan. Moses granted them the request, but they were to help the other tribes in the conquest of the land, then return to their families in the land they had been given. Moses reminded them that if they did not do as they had agreed they would be guilty of sin and "be sure your sin will find you out" (Number 32:23). As I think about this statement in Number 32:23, I am reminded of the commercial that the city of Las Vegas sponsors that states, "What happens in Vegas stays in Vegas." The sentiment of the commercial is what many think about the sins of their lives. They believe that what they do in their own privacy is their business and no one should say or do anything about it.

In thinking about this, it would do us well to think of a couple of lessons we should get clear in our minds from what Moses said.

It does not say if or when. Many think that sins are only a problem if and when they are known. The fact is that all sins are problems in our relationship with God. In Isaiah 59:2 we read, "But your iniquities have separated between you and your God, and your sins have hid his face from you..." We must understand that sins will cost us an eternity with God unless we deal with and correct them according to God's will. Man may not know our sins, but God does. The Hebrew writer said, "Neither is there any creature that is not manifest in his sight: but all things are naked and opened unto the eyes of him with whom we have to do" (Hebrews 4:13).

Your sins will find you out. Every criminal commits a crime thinking that it is a perfect crime. But many criminals will slip and the crime is detected and proven. However, some crimes may be committed that men may never know of, but there is not a sin that God does not know. The wise man said, "For God will bring every work into judgement, with every secret thing, whether it be good or evil" (Ecclesiastes 12:14).

Remember the sin of Achan in Judges 7? When the children of Israel took the city of Jericho, they were told not to take anything. But Achan took of the spoils of the city and hid it among his things. No one knew about it, but God did! After the children of Israel were victorious at Jerichco they were defeated by Ai, and God told Joshua that sin was among them because they had taken of the spoils of Jericho. Another example of sin being covered and hidden from men is the sin of David. David committed fornication with Bathsheba and hid the sin from those around him. He lied and had Urriah, Bathsheba husband, killed trying to cover and hide his sin (2 Samuel 11). David thought the sin was covered and hidden and that no one knew. The fact is, our sins separate us from God and can cost us an eternal life of bliss. Remember the promise in Revelation 14:13, "Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord..." When we put on Christ in baptism we are dead to our sins and are in Christ (Galatians 3:27; Romans 6:3-6). As we put on Christ, then we serve Him and seek to please Him. As we confess our sins, and God will forgive us (1 John 1:9).
