Things Which Are Precious

Most of us could make a long list of things which are precious in our lives; wives, husbands, children, parents. These are precious because they are irreplaceable. They are so precious that nothing can compare with their worth. Others might include accomplishments that could never be duplicated. Many things are precious to people. The apostle Peter spoke of several precious things in his letter to believers. These of which Peter spoke are much more precious than family members or any accomplishments here on earth.

Trials are precious. "In this you greatly rejoice, even though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been distressed by various trials, that the proof of your faith, being more precious than gold, which is perishable even though tested by fire, may be found to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ" (1 Peter 1:6-7). Peter tells us that trials shape our faith, and that they are more precious than gold. Gold perishes - possessions are unreliable. Faith will, however, sustain us until the appearance of Jesus. Faith will be our confidence even as life changes or as death approaches.

The blood of Jesus is precious. In 1 Peter 1:18-19, Peter says we are "redeemed by the precious blood of Christ..." The Jews offered animal sacrifices and yet their sins were not taken away (Hebrews 10:4). Jesus' blood differed from all other sacrifices. His gift was without blemish. His sacrifice was perfect.

The faith of others is precious. 2 Peter 1:1 "... to those who through the righteousness of our God and Savior Jesus Christ have received a faith as precious as ours." This verse teaches that everybody can have saving faith--that faith which leads to salvation through the Gospel (Rom. 10:17).

God's promises are precious. "Whereby, we are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises..." 2 Peter 1:4. God always keeps His promises. He cannot lie (Hebrews 6:18; Titus 1:2). Let us trust in God and believe Him — He who has promised us eternal salvation if

we would follow Him and abide in His teachings. Say friends, what is precious to you?

Pay Attention

A man was killed on the local freeway yesterday. Police report that he first got his car entangled in the cable barrier in the median. He managed to get out safely, but he then walked into oncoming traffic--all the while talking on his cell phone!

This article is not about how distracting and dangerous cell phones are to drivers. It is about allowing ourselves to be distracted on the journey through life. Bad things happen when we are not paying attention, among them.

Sin. "Be of sober spirit, be on the alert. Your adversary, the devil, prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour" (1 Peter 5:8). Satan is subtle. He tries to catch us off guard. If we are not careful, sin is the result, with all its ugly consequences. 1 Corinthians 10:12 sounds a warning to overconfident brethren who think they can toy with temptation and not be affected: "Therefore let him who thinks he stands take heed that he does not fall."

Lost opportunities. "So then, while we have opportunity, let us do good to all men, and especially to those who are of the household of faith" (Galatians 6:10). What if we are not looking for those opportunities? What if we are focused mostly on self? We will be goats in Jesus' shepherd picture of the judgment: "Lord, when did we ever see You hungry, or thirsty, or a stranger, or naked, or sick, or in prison, and did not take care of You" (Matthew 25:44). The goats went to eternal punishment (v. 46).

False teaching. Paul warned the Ephesian elders, "I know that after my departure savage wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock; and from among your ownselves men will arise, speaking perverse things,

to draw away the disciples after them. Therefore be on the alert..." (Acts 20:29-31). Our shepherds must be watchful, yet each of us is responsible to avoid the wolves. John wrote, "For many deceivers have gone out into the world... Watch yourselves, that you do not lose what we have accomplished, but that you may receive a full reward" (2 John 7-8).

Lack of readiness. "Therefore be on the alert, for you do not know which day your Lord is coming" (Matthew 24:42). May God help us all not to be distracted by the scenery or "fall asleep at the wheel" in His service.

Our Daily Need For Christ

Seems like it happens more and more to me. It must be because people know that I am a preacher. And I suppose it comes with the territory as is often said. What I am talking about is this: people asking me to pray for them. I get that request repeatedly.

I view it as an honor that people ask me to pray for them. Some people must think that what I say in prayer is more powerful than what they can say. Or most likely, they know that the more people praying the better it is. I have had people call me on the phone and after pouring out their hearts about a troubled life, ask me if I will pray for them. I always do. Sometimes I get an email from someone I have met while traveling and they ask me to remember them in prayer. I always do. I've been asked by friends, elders in other congregations, and family members visiting a loved one in the hospital. Will you pray for me? What a touching request!

Just today I met with someone who owns a business. The market has been soft for them and they over purchased some equipment. Payments were high, income was low. This person told me that things were

desperate and some of the equipment needed to be sold. I was asked, "Will you say a prayer that someone will buy this stuff?" Something about that request grabbed by attention. I have tried to talk to this person about Jesus and have gotten no response. I have invited this person to come and worship with us. Nothing. Zero. No interest. But on this day, the subject of prayer was brought up and it wasn't by me. This person is so desperate that he realizes that he needs to call in help. He needs prayers. Yet, I wonder if his equipment is sold, will there be any prayers of thanksgiving to God or will there be a renewed interest in learning more of the God of Heaven and earth? Or, is God the last resource for a desperate and discouraged person? Could it be that after everything else has been tried and nothing seems to work, then and only then, is prayer something that ought to be tried?

I did pray for this person. I prayed for something more important than the selling of his equipment. I prayed for the salvation of his soul. I prayed that he would see that God is not to be used just when we need Him and then discarded when we get what we want. God deserves better than that.

We sing a song that says, "I need Thee every hour..." but I wonder if we really feel that way. The early disciples seemed to have a good understanding of this:

- Jesus told them to pray for their *daily* bread (Matthew 6:11)
- The Lord wants us to take up our cross *daily* (Luke 9:23)
- The Bereans searched the Scriptures *daily* to see whether those things were so (Acts 17:11)
- The apostles taught *daily* (Acts 5:42)
- The Hebrews were told to encourage one another *daily* (Heb. 3:13)

We need the Lord every day. We need the Lord to guide our steps every day. We need the Lord to forgive our sins every day. We need the Lord to strengthen us every day. We need to pray every day.

Our faith need to be a *daily* faith. Not a Sunday morning faith. Not a "get me out of trouble" faith. And not a faith that changes like the weather. *Yes, I need Thee every hour!*
