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## The Secret Things of God

From the forbidden fruit to what our resurrected bodies will look like, we are not given specific information on many things. Man in his ignorance has said the forbidden fruit was an apple and assumes our eternal bodies will be the same as our current ones, but God has not revealed the answers to these and many other questions.

Is there life on other planets? Are there other "earths" in the many galaxies we see? Has God experienced creation many times over and will He continue doing so after He brings this world to an end? Why is Satan more powerful than other angels? If he is an angel that rebelled, how come other angels have not succeeded him in evil dominion? As we ponder the possibilities to these and other intriguing thoughts, let us not "ponder" ourselves into denial and disbelief. Paul warned, "But avoid foolish and ignorant disputes, knowing that they generate strife" (2 Timothy 2:23). There is such a thing as wrestling over uncertain things to the point of creating confusion, doubt, and division. This is not only foolish, it can also lead to a bitter and divisive spirit, which God has made clear is an offense to Him (Pro. 6:19). Besides all this, He has given us plenty to learn and decipher from His word to keep us busy, instead of wasting time on wrestling over the unknowable.

How many churches did Jesus establish? What kind of music does He want in worship? When does He want saints to take the Lord's Supper? What kind of organization does He want in local churches? What role do women have in public teaching? What does He think about divorce? What is the church to do with unfaithful members? God has answered these

questions (see Ephesians 4:1-4; Colossians 3:16; Acts 20:7; Titus 1:5; 1 Timothy 2:11-12; Matthew19:1-9; 2 Thessalonians 3:14). It is our responsibility to rightly divide the Bible to find these answers. (2 Timothy 2:15) and to remain content with God's will (1 John 2:3-6). Anything not given is not God's will for us to know.

Of course, God has blessed us. The fact is without dispute. Even in a time of economic downturn, high unemployment and rising gas prices, most folks have it pretty good. Our "poor" would be middle class in many countries of the world. in fact, most "poor" people enjoy creature comforts unknown to millions of people in impoverished countries.

We have great wealth, technological resources, educational opportunities, leisure, and the ability to pursue whatever it is we may desire or dream. yet, it seems that we are less grateful, less religious, and more proud and self-reliant than ever.

So, will God continue to bless us?

Abraham Lincoln once said, "It is the duty of nations, as well as of men, to own their own independence upon the overruling power of God...and to recognize the sublime truth announced in the Holy Scriptures and provide by all history, that those nations only are

blest whose God is Lord."

The basis of Lincoln's words are found in Psalm 33:12. They are as true today as when Lincoln said them and the Psalmist penned them. However, it is apparent that we are no longer one nation under God. Secularism, atheism and agnosticism have undermined our core values. The spread of Eastern religion and belief in Islam and their god, Allah, has further eroded our "Christian" precepts and principles.

Will God bless America when our people are reveling in wickedness at every turn? Corruption in business and government, the promotion of pornographic materials, breakdown of the family and an increase of deviant crimes against children. Furthermore, we are in the midst of a great struggle regarding the sanctity of marriage. William Bennett was right when he wrote, "the real crisis of our time is spiritual."

As a result, God promises to hear, forgive and heal. If God is to bless America, Christians must make a difference. Let us lead the way. Let us be the light. Let us be the salt. And let us stand up and be heard before it is too late!

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## Rise Up and Build

The seventy years of exile which God had brought upon His people in punishment for their sins was drawing to a close. Jerusalem lay in overgrown ruins, and the land had received rest from the unfaithfulness of the Jews. Now it was time for the nation of God's people to be restored. As we can read in the books of Ezra and Nehemiah, this restoration took place in three major stages.

## **Restoring Worship**

The first major stage of the restoration of Israel began in 539 BC when the Persian king, Cyrus acting under the direction of the LORD God of heaven, sent the Jews home to Jerusalem to rebuild the temple (Ezra 1:1-4). The major leaders of God's people at this time were Zerubbabel, their governor, and Joshua the High Priest. They led a group of over 42,000 of God's people on a return journey to the land of promise (Ezra 2:64). As soon as they return, they began observing the feasts and sacrifices of Moses' law. With the prompting and encouragement of God's prophets, Haggai and Zechariah, the temple was begun (Ezra 3:11-13), and after a lengthy delay (Ezra 4), finally finished (Ezra 5-6). God's people could fully worship Him again!

## Restoring the Law

The second major component of the restoration of Israel took place under the leadership of Ezra, the scribe. He led another large group of Jews back to the Promised Land (Ezra 7-8). When he got there, he discovered that the people had become lax in their observance of God's commands. He took bold and direct action to restore the knowledge and observance of God's law among the surviving remnant of God's people. This included calling them to repentance when it was discovered they had

become involved in unlawful foreign marriages (Ezra 9-10), and teaching them God's law so that they could renew their covenant with God to live faithfully as His people (Nehemaih 8-10).

## Restoring the Walls

The third major stage of restoration was led by a man named Nehemiah. As a cupbearer to the Persian King Artaxerxes, he asked for and received permission to go lead the rebuilding of the physical walls of Jerusalem. When he arrived, his prayerful and dynamic leadership resulted in the walls being completely rebuilt in just fifty-two days (Nehemiah 6:15). God's people had physical security provided in a way that made it clear that God was their true protection. As their governor for the next twelve years, Nehemiah made sure that more walls were built in the hearts, minds and lives of the people, between themselves and the pagan people of the land (Nehemiah 13:1-9, 23-31), between the Sabbath day and other days of the week (Nehemiah 13:15-22), and between what was right and wrong (Nehemiah 5:1-13).

In many lives, homes, communities and nations throughout the world today, restoration is desperately needed. Wherever true restoration occurs, it involves the same three components that were manifest in the great restoration of the Old Testament. Worship must be restored according to the pattern of God's word. The law of Christ, rather than of Moses, must be proclaimed and observed, and walls must be built and defended in the lives of God's people that mark the boundaries of God's heavenly city. Are you taking part in the great restoration? As the men of Jerusalem said to Nehemiah, "Let us rise up and build!" (Nehemiah 2:18)
