Justifying Self

Luke 10, we read of a lawyer that stood up and asked Jesus the question, "What shall I do to inherit eternal life?" (v. 25). In answer to his question, Jesus ask, "what is written in the law?" The lawyer answered in verse 27, "Thou shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and will all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as thyself." Jesus then told him that he had answered correctly, and if he did these things, he would live. After Jesus answered the lawyer, Luke records, "But he, wanting to justify himself, said to Jesus, And who is my neighbor?"

How often does this happen in life? When children know what their parents' rules are, but will try to justify themselves after disobeying. In the workplace, someone does something that the boss has told them not to do; they begin to justify themselves by acting as if they did not understand what was expected. Not only do people try to justify their actions in these situations, but also in their relationship with God. Someone will be shown how their life is out of harmony with the will of God and they may in effect say, "I know that is what the Bible teaches, but I ...". An example of this in the Scriptures. In the Garden of Eden, Adam and Eve know they were not to eat "of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil" (Genesis 2:17). But Eve was tempted to eat and ate of the forbidden fruit and then gave to Adam, and he ate. When God asked Adam about eating of the fruit of the tree that he had told them not to eat, Adam replied, "The woman thou gave to be with me, she gave me of the tree, and I did eat" (Genesis 3:12). Notice Adam tried to justify his sin by pointing to Eve, the woman that God had given to Adam. Eve tried to justify herself when asked about eating the forbidden fruit, said, "The serpent beguiled me, and I did eat" (Genesis 3:13). There are other times in scripture that we see men justifying their actions before God, but it is the first. God was not pleased with self-justification then, and Jesus was not satisfied with the lawyer justifying himself in Luke 10.

We must understand that Jesus is not seeking people to justify

themselves in their own eyes; rather he want followers to “deny” themselves and follow after him (Luke 9:23). To deny self-means that our interest will change. The apostle Paul exemplified this in his life as he wrote to the Philippians concerning the things of this life that he gave up to be a Christian, a follower of Christ. Paul said, “... I count all things but loss for the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and do count them but rubbish, that I may gain Christ” (Philippians 3:8). As followers of Christ, we should no longer seek our own good, but the good for the cause of Christ. There will be no room to justify self for we will have crucified self. The lives which we live will be lives that show Christ living in us (Galatians 2:20). To “crucify” takes humility. We must humble ourselves to the will of God. Paul reminds us of the example Jesus. Writing to the Philippians Paul said, “Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, who being in the form of God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but emptied Himself by taking the form of a servant, and coming in the likeness of men. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself, and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross” (Philippians 2:5-8). Notice Paul says that Jesus “humbled himself, and became obedient.” Seeking self-justification is not humbling of one’s self, but is the opposite. Self-justification will cause one not to submit to the will of God and therefore not receive the forgiveness of sins that the promised (Acts 2:38; 1 John 1:9).

In Matthew 7:22, Jesus pictures those that will appear before him at the judgment that will seek to justify themselves as they say, “Lord, Lord, have we prophesied in your name, and cast demons in your name, and done many wonderful works in your name?” Jesus response to them is not a commendation, but a rebuke. “And then I will declare to them, I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness” (v. 23). Jesus is still the same and will not accept self-justification for those who live are no in harmony with the will of God.

Is your life in peace with God? Or, are you seeking justification for the sins you have committed? You are the one who is responsible for your soul. God will only receive those whose lives are in agreement with His will (Matthew 7:21). Don’t seek self-justification, but humbly submit to the will of God.

Studying The Bible

The divided state of the religious world is at the very least puzzling. The existence of hundreds of different “churches” in America attests to the fact that there is rampant confusion and disagreement in the religious world as to what is true and what is right before the Lord. What are faithful Christians to do when issues arise which divide?

Shall the issues be ignored in the hope that they will somehow go away? That will not work. It never has. Shall we wait to see how many will stand on one side or the other and then cast our lot with the majority? Shall we make our decision based on what great and good men think about it? Shall we support a position on the ground that “we have always done it that way?” Surely, these are all false standards. May I suggest some simple but basic rules to help us decide what is right and wrong in God’s sight?

Respect The Authority of The Scriptures:

The word of God should always be man’s standard of authority in all religious matters. “Whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him” (Colossians 3:17 NKJV). The phrase “in the name of the Lord” in this passage refers to the inherent authority of the name of Jesus Christ. An individual must be able to produce positive authority from God’s word for everything he preaches and practices in order to glorify God.

Jesus Christ revealed God’s word in a manner that mankind can understand. Paul believed man could understand the truth if he would read and study it - “You have heard of the dispensation of the grace of God which was given to me for you, how that by revelation he made known to me the mystery (as I have briefly written already, by which, when you read, you may understand my knowledge in the mystery of Christ)” (Ephesians 3:2-4). In essence Paul is saying we can “understand” as much as he understood concerning the truth. What a wonderful promise!

Handle Accurately The Word of Truth:

The New American Standard Bible’s translation

of 2 Timothy 2:15 relays Paul charge "Be diligent to present yourself approved to God as a workman who does not need to be ashamed, handling accurately the word of truth." An individual must study the Bible to find the truth on any and every religious subject. We must consider all that the Bible says on a subject. If more than one passage deals with a matter, then honest study requires we regard the sum total of all God said about it before reaching a conclusion.

Resolve To Follow Whatever Course Truth Demands:

What is the benefit of finding truth on any given subject unless we are determined to accept it, regardless of the cost? We must be as the man who found the pearl of great price and sold all he had in order to obtain it.

When an individual has closed his mind to any alternative other than the one he has chosen, then it is very easy for him to see and yet not see, to hear and yet not hear. Jesus Christ warned about the danger of a closed mind. "For the hearts of this people have grown dull. Their ears are hard of hearing, And their eyes they have closed, Lest they should see with their eyes and hear with their ears, Lest they should understand with their hearts and turn, So that I should heal them" (Matthew 13:15).
