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Maintaining Our Spiritual Appetite

The Christian's life is to be a life that is one of growth and development. Peter writes to Christians and exhorts them to "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 3:18). However, this is far too often not the case among Christians. After obeying the gospel, they lose their fervor, zeal, and thirst for spiritual things, and lives are filled with secular pursuits to the point that are so busy and filled with many pressing physical concerns. Lives filled with earthly pursuits is a serious problem. How can Christians guard against being overcome with the material pursuits and have an insatiable appetite for spiritual things?

Have An Understanding of the Physical and Spiritual. The problem of not having a right and proper understanding of the physical and spiritual things is detrimental to a Christian's growth. Many see life in the realm of the physical. But physical things are here for our proper use and enjoyment. They are not to be the end of all things in this life. John warns Christians not to love this world. "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life is not of the Father but is of the world. And the world passeth away, and the lust thereof: but he that doeth the will of God abideth forever" (1 John 2:15-17). The world is passing away, and the things of this physical life will one day be all gone, but the spiritual things which are seen by faith are the things that will endure (2 Corinthians 4:16-5:2). So let us understand the necessity of feeding upon the spiritual things.

The Necessity of Minding Spiritual Things. In Romans 8:5 Paul writes, "For they that are after the flesh do mind the things of the flesh; but they that are after the Spirit the things of the spirit." Paul is making it clear that our devotion to the physical, worldly enticements will end in death. We must give our devotion to the things of the Spirit and live a life focused on God and obeying Him. What can we do to maintain our appetite for spiritual things?

- 1. *Read the Bible.* Reading the Bible does not mean just reading to cover the book. Rather, it is reading in such a way to understand the context and the meaning of what we are reading (1 Timothy 4:13; 2 Timothy 2:15; Acts 17:11). The reading of God's word will involve a consistent study, and this will take some effort.
- 2. *Pray.* Ask God for wisdom in applying the knowledge you have gleaned from His Word. Pray for courage, to stand for what is right, in whatever opposition you might face. Talk with the Lord in prayer daily and cast your cares upon Him. To be spiritually minded we must talk to the Lord daily in prayer. James says, "The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much" (James 5:16). One thing accomplished through prayer is that there is a recognition of God, who He is, and who we are.
- 3. *Sing.* The lifting of one's voice to praise and exalt the name of God helps to bring one closer to God. James says, "Is any merry let him sing" (James 5:16). The thoughts of the song and the truths that are taught help our minds to focus on the things that are above and keeps our spiritual appetite keen.
- 4. Spend Time With Other Christians. Hebrews 10:25 teaches that Christians should not forsake the assembling with the church, but the Hebrew writer also stresses the value spiritually the assemblies have in our being together. "Let us hold fast the profession of our faith...let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works...exhorting one another, and so much the more as ye see the day approaching (Hebrews 10:23-25). Assembling with other Christians at every opportunity builds us up spiritually and increases our spiritual appetite. Yes, spending time together, whether in or out of the assemblies, is important. Much is said in the scriptures about hospitality. Why? Because of its value to us spiritually. Let us never think lightly of times for us to gather together as just something to take or leave. Let us see these opportunities for growth and spiritual strengthen of ourselves and others. Let us use these times to encourage ourselves and others to greater spiritual work.
- 5. Work To Serve Others. We must always remember the work of service. Jesus came to serve, not to be served (Matthew 20:28). Let us not forget that to grow spiritually and to become more Christ-like, we will be servants. As Peter described Jesus to those gathered at Cornelius' house he said, "He went about doing good"

(Acts 10:38). Dorcas was a faithful Christian, who died and was remembered for the good deeds (works of service) she did while she was living (Acts 9:36,39). The service of Dorcas follows the example of Christ. The Hebrew writer reminds us to run the race of life "looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith" (Hebrews 12:2). When we "look to Jesus" we see His service to others, His compassion for others and His love for others. Seeing and the example He left for us will help us to be more like Christ and will help keep our spiritual appetite strong. Peter reminds the Christians he writes to lay aside evil and ungodly practices and then says, "As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby" (1 Peter 2:2).

May we with all diligence work to develop and desire the influence of God's word in our life. Let us do the things that will draw us closer to God and closer to heaven.

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Consider Me Irrelevant

Rob Bell, former pastor of a megachurch, said in an interview with Oprah Winfrey that any church that does not endorse same-sex marriages will become irrelevant. Regarding accepting homosexuality in spite of the Bible, he says, "I think culture is already there and the church will continue to be even more irrelevant when it quotes letters from 2,000 years ago as their best defense" (The Huffington Post, 2/20/15).

Our nation is gradually adopting Bell's reasoning. More and more "Christian" are rushing to the defense of homosexuality and learning to "approve of those who practice" it (Romans 1:32). The current tactic of the devil is to convince people to view it in the same light as the racial injustice of the past. "It was wrong to reject a black man for his skin color and it is wrong to reject a homosexual for marrying someone he loves."

We all can see that racism is a sin (Acts 10:34-35). But by duping us into thinking we are just as unloving for opposing sexual perversion, the devil has tricked us into defending error. And now that "Christian pastors" are telling us churches are irrelevant if we do not endorse same-sex marriage, and the Bible is outdated in condemning it, we are that much closer to what God said of Sodom and Gomorrah before He destroyed them: "their sin is very grave" (Genesis 18:20).

Believe what you want, dear friends, but I choose to act like Lot when he lived in Sodom—he "was oppressed by the filthy conduct of the wicked...from day to day by seeing and hearing their lawless deeds" (2 Peter 2:7-8). He did not let the world convince him to redefine God's will on this matter, and hopefully, neither will I. The Bible says it is a sin for a church to endorse any sin, especially that of a sexual nature (1 Corinthians 5). The only way God forgives homosexuality is when it is repented of and removed by the blood of Christ (1 Corinthians 6:9-10; Acts 18:8). The church I attend might become fewer in number for upholding these antiquated principles, but the truth of God's will has never been determined by the number of people who deem it relevant (Genesis 19:14; Matthew 7:13-14).
