## Lord of the Lonely

Psalm 68:6 "God sets the lonely in families" (NIV). Ten years ago today, our long voyage to adopt a little girl from China was finally over as Min Qin He officially became Molly Anne Qin Chumbley. In the strictness sense, adoption is a legal process. In our case, that process involved two national governments, the state of Alabama and the county of Limestone. Countless papers were filed and refiled (especially after Homeland Security lost our original documents) and after 17 months of paperwork, Molly became a part of our family.

Much greater than the legal process is the blessings adoption brings. On one hand it's a blessing for "the lonely" who now has a family of their own. On the other hand, it's a blessing for the adoptive family who have welcomed a child into their home to raise as their own. Adoption is a wonderful thing and many Christians throughout the Kingdom of God have opened their homes to become "fathers to the fatherless."

But as wonderful it is that the lonely, acquire a new home. The deepest and strongest foundation of adoption is located not in the act of humans adopting humans. But in God the Father adopting the repentant sinner as His child.

In Galatians 4:4-7, Paul will write about our adoption to the family of God. "But when the fullness of the time had come, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, that we might receive the adoption as sons. And because you are sons, God has sent forth the Spirit of His Son into your hearts, crying out, "Abba, Father!" Therefore you are no longer a slave but a son, and if a son, then an heir of God through Christ."

In Ephesians 1:3-6 he writes that our adoption was "before the foundation of the world." This means that our adoption was always in the mind of God. He planned and predestinated it and made it possible by His Son, that those who submit to His Will might become His own special people (1 Peter 2:9-10).

And when God adopts us as His children we receive the same blessings as the "only Begotten." Romans 8:16-17 "The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ..."

I had a nightmare a few years ago, where Molly was taken from us. I was begging for them to give us back that "little girl with the freckle on her nose," but she was gone. I woke up from that nightmare. For God to say to you at the end of your life "I never knew you," is nightmare you will never wake up from. Don't let that happen!

Our eternal destiny is so completely dependent upon the grace of God - which grace is accepted by us through faith. All will hear the trumpet sound (1 Corinthians 15:52) - all who are living on this earth will respond to the call. They will leave their beds, their work benches, their desk, their fields and their games, to heed the summons of the trumpet call. Besides that, all those whose bodies have been in the grave - those buried yesterday and even those buried thousands of years ago, will arise "in the twinkling of an eye" (2 Peter 3:10). Wonderful!
