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The Lord Has A Church

The Lord has a church in the New Testament. It is identified as a : body (Ephesians 1:21-22); household (Ephesians 2:19; 1 Timothy 3:15); temple (Ephesians 2:20-21); and kingdom (Colossians 1:13).

The church as a body is made up of members. "For as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function, so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another" (Romans 12:4-5). Thus, the Lord has a church (body) made up of members subordinate to Him as the "head over all things to the church, which is His body..." (Ephesians 1:22-23). Not a single thing pertaining to the body is to be done without the authority of Christ. - He is head over *all things* to the church. If all good people respected the authority of Christ in *all things* unity would prevail in the religious world and there would be no party (denominational) names. All who truly desire to serve Christ would unite under the name (authority) of Christ. "For there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12). We could all be members of that same (one) body of which we read: "Christ is head of the church; and He is the Savior of the body" (Ephesians 5:23).

The church, this body, is a household indicating it is a familial relationship which is sustains to God. The Hebrew writer declared, "Christ as a Son of God over His own house, whose house we are if we hold fast the confidence and the rejoicing of the hope firm to the end" (3:6). Thus, the New Testament teaches that the Lord's family is His church. The church, God's family, was established by the blood God adopts us as his children when we conform our wills to do His will (Ephesians 1:5-14; Romans 8:29-30).

The church, the body, the house is also presented to us in the imagery of a temple. "Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If anyone defiles the temple of God, God will destroy him. For the temple of God is holy, which temple you are" (1 Corinthians 3:16-17). The word translated temple is a rich image to picture. The temple in the Old Testament was where Deity dwelt and where

priests ministered and attended the alters of sacrifice and praise to God. The Lord has a temple (figuratively speaking) made up of priests, who minister and attend the alter according to direction of their High Priests who is Christ (Hebrews 3:1) and where the Spirit of God dwells (Ephesians 2:20-23) – it is the church of Christ. Thus, only those who serve and worship God "in spirit and in truth" (John 4:24) comprise the temple of God.

Finally, the church, the body, the house, the temple is identified as the kingdom. Jesus as King of Kings (1 Timothy 6:15) must have a kingdom. The perfect expression of that kingdom is found in the church. "Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom which cannot be shaken, let us have grace, by which we may serve God acceptably with reverence and godly fear" (Hebrews 12:28). The Lord has a kingdom over which His rule is manifested and respected by those who are citizens of His kingdom – it is His church. For as His church is made up of the saved "He has delivered [them] from the power of darkness and conveyed [them] into the kingdom..." (Colossians 1:13).

Yes the Lord has a church and depending on what characteristic you want to discuss it is referred to in the New Testament as the body, family, temple and a kingdom. Yet. it is clear that whatever imagery we use one must be born again to enter into the body, family, and kingdom to serve as a priest in the temple of God (1 Corinthians 12:13; John 3:3-5; Galatians 3:26-27). Have you been born again, baptized into Christ to have your sins washed away and forgiven? (Colossians 2:12-13). The New Testament makes it clear, the Lord has a church. Are you a member of the Lord's church?

A Life Well Lived

Loosing loved ones is never easy. Carnal wisdom teaches us that death is part of the circle of life; however, wisdom that is from above reminds us that death is our enemy, and is in the world because of sin. It never gets easier to deal with. Whenever we lose a loved one, we find ourselves face to face with a harsh reality: death comes to all. In light of this, we seek wisdom. There is perhaps no more helpful source of wisdom regarding the difficult realities of life than the book of Ecclesiastes. In his treatise on life, Solomon has much to say about our end purpose, "Fear God and keep His commandments, for this is man's all" (Ecclesiastes 12:14). While this is the overarching principle which governs our life, there are some things the preacher teaches us in chapter 9 that will help us to live life well — right now.

Live. As Christians, we often feel as though life cannot be truly experienced and enjoyed. This feeling stems from a misunderstanding of our liberties in Christ and focuses on restrictions. Consider what Solomon teaches: "Go, eat your bread with joy, and drink your wine with a merry heart, for God has already approved what you do" (Ecclesiastes 9:7). God does in fact want us to enjoy life! We should experience life with joy and a merry heart. Call your loved ones. Go out with friends. Christians especially ought to find great joy in sharing our lives with our brethren.

Laugh. "Let your garments be always white. Let not oil be lacking on your head" (Ecclesiastes 9:8). Wearing white has long been associated with celebration and happy occasions. Pouring oil on your head would be similar to us putting on perfume or cologne. Solomon teaches here that since death comes to all, we need to be treating everyday as a joyous occasion. Take the time to laugh at life. Some would say, "What do I have to rejoice about? I could die any time." Exactly! That's a great reason to let every waking moment be a celebration of God's gift of life. Don't go around with a black cloak covering your heart, but instead find the joy and life and laugh! Life is too short not to.

Love. It seems ironic to listen to Solomon's advice on love, but after all the women, he speaks now in the singular. "Enjoy life with the wife whom you love, all the days of your fleeting life" (Ecclesiastes 9:9). He is saying that in order to make the most of life while you are alive, enjoy life with your love every single day. Be

thankful for the spouse of your youth and show that appreciation always. Listen, talk, and spend time with the one who holds your heart. God created marriage so man and woman could share their lives. Don't waste time, we won't live forever.

Labor. It has been said that a man of fifty, having worked since school, will have put in 56,000 hours of work. Imagine 56,000 hours of boredom and resentment towards your job. What effect will that have on your mind and your soul? Solomon tells us that part of living life to the fullest is labor and work. Our attitude towards not only our jobs, but all work, has a huge impact on our lives. "Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with your might, for there is no work or thought or knowledge or wisdom in Sheol, to which you are going" (Ecclesiastes 9:10). Why work? Because once we die, there is no more. Make the most of today. Work — and find joy in it!

At the end of your life, will people say you had a life well lived? God has granted us life, and he means for us to live it! It all begins with our attitudes towards God. Consider these things, and may God bless you with many more days to serve him!!
