# 612 Is God Pleased With Denominationalism?

It is clearly obvious to any casual observer that the religious world is divided. As a matter of fact, division in religion is considered the norm in our society. People claim to be members of various denominational religious groups that all claim to be following Jesus as their Lord and Savior. Many in the religious world believe that God is pleased with the numerous denominations and people are encouraged to "Attend the Church of Your Choice." But we must ask, "Is God pleased with the religious division that exists today?" The only way that we can know whether or not God is pleased with anything is by looking to what He has revealed to us in the scriptures (1 Corinthians 2:9-13). If we do not find God's approval of something in the scriptures then to practice such is sinful because it is outside the law of God (1 John 3:4; cf. 2 John 9). Let us then examine the scriptures and see if God is pleased with the practice of denominationalism that is prevalent in our world today.

#### What Is Denominationalism

When asked, "What denomination are you a member of?" people will quickly respond by calling a name of a religious group of which they are a member. According to the <u>American Heritage Dictionary</u>, the word "denomination" means "a large group of religious congregations united under a common faith and name and organized under a single administrative and legal hierarchy." According to Webster, it means "a religious organization uniting in a single legal and administrative body a number of local congregations." A denomination then is simply, a group of congregations that are joined under some governing body:

- 1. The number of congregations can be as few as two or more.
- 2. This tie to a governing body above the local congregation, by definition they are "denominated" from all congregations that do not submit to the same authority. It must be understood that division is necessary for denominations to exist.

Without religious division, no denominations would exist. Denominationalism involves the "naming" of a group that believes a particular set of doctrines and beliefs. Their name distinguishes them from other

groups that believe other things, concerning faith and practice. Denominationalism results in the division of one group from another and each group concentrating on the matters involving their denominational interests.

Without a doubt, there are many in the religious world claiming to be members of various denominations that would not claim to agree with the teaching of and are not devoted to the principles or interests of the denomination of which they are a member. Many will claim that the Bible is the guide for faith and practice rather than the creed books of their particular denomination. So with this thought in mind many ask, "Is denominationalism all that bad?" The answer to that is an emphatic "Yes!" The reason why is because in participating in a denomination we are encouraging division and calling ourselves something besides Christians and glory goes to some one other than Christ.

#### What About Divison?

Paul writing to the church at Corinth about the problems they were having, "Now I plead with you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you; but that ye be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgement...Now I say this, that each of you says, 'I am of Paul 'and ' I am of Apollos,' and 'I am of Cephas,' and I am of Christ. Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul?" (1 Corinthians 1:10, 12-13). Notice that the dividing of those professing to be Christians into different groups and giving themselves different names is condemned as being wrong and not pleasing to God. It is in opposition to the prayer Jesus prayed saying, "I do not pray for these alone, but also for those who will believe in Me through their word; that they all may be one, as You, Father, are in me, and I in You, that they also may be one in Us, that they world may believe that You sent Me" (John 17:20-21). Jesus desire was for all believers in Him to be one, not many splinter groups teaching many different doctrines. Paul wrote of God's plan for unity encouraging the Christians at Ephesus "endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called in one hope of your calling; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all and in you all" (Ephesians 4:3-6)

#### The Body

In God's plan for unity, the first things Paul mentions is that here is "one body." The body is the church and Paul had this clear early in this epistle when he wrote

concerning the authority of Christ and said, "He put all things under His feet, and gave Him to be head over all things to the church, which is His body, the fulness of Him who fills all in all" (Ephesians 1:22-23). The unity that God expects and demands is a unity that in in one body or church. God has not approved of various religious bodies or denominations which compose the universal church. The body or the Lord's church is composed of all Christians from all times (Hebrews 12:23). The church is not given an early hierarchy with a headquarters on earth. Christ is the head of the church (Colossians 1:18; Ephesians 1:22-23). Individuals make up the body as they are "baptized into one body" (1 Corinthians 12:13, 27). In Acts 2 the Scriptures teach that when one obeys the gospel of Christ, he/she is added by the Lord to the church or the body (Acts 2:37-47). After becoming a Christian then we are to find a group of people that are following the divine pattern God has given for worship and work and join ourselves to that local congregation (Acts 9:17-18, 26). These local congregations are not a denomination. They are independent, autonomous groups following the divine pattern in the Scriptures. They are not tied together by any human organizations, such as headquarters, councils, synods or societies to other congregations. The head is Christ, and it is from His word we receive instructions for our faith and practice (Colossians 1:18; Romans 10:17). As Christians come together to form a local church, they are not becoming a "Church of Christ" denomination, but a church whose devotion is to Christ and His cause.

Let us recognize that be having membership in a denomination; the implication is that we advocate division and separation into religious denominations. The fact is we cannot find any evidence in the New Testament of the practice or acceptance of denominationalism. Instead, the New Testament clearly condemns division. Therefore, denominationalism is not a part of God's plan and is wrong and should be rejected by those that claim to be followers of Christ.

They cater to the "whole man" and offer everything from sports and all kinds of entertainment to various kinds of counselors and self-esteem workshops. The modern concept of being a church has developed into a free - for - all - do - what - you - want - just - satisfy - my - every - whim debacle. The world thinks that the church exists just to care for social concerns - they shouldn't have "religious" or moral influence at all. If they want to feed the poor or help the homeless, that is fine, but if they want to preach God and moral values, they should keep it to themselves. Sadly, many modern churches have done just that.

The Lord's church was never built to satisfy the whims of social man. read the New Testament. Never do we find the church trying to feed all the poor in the world. Never do we find the church trying to :make disciples" of the nations (Matt. 28:19) by offering ball teams and ice cream. Never do we find the church pandering the social whims of man. That's just not the work that the Lord gave the church to do. We may think of such work as "nice" and "compassionate," but the Scriptures do not reveal that work for the church.

I do not mean to sound unsympathetic to the social desires of mankind. Those things have a place, and as individuals we have obligations to our fellow men. But the point we must understand is this: we can feed the world, entertain the world, and play with the world, but such things do not save souls! And this brings us right back to our function as a church.

Jesus came to seek and save the lost (Luke 19:10), a work infinitely more important than providing temporary shelter. He gave the same charge to His disciples (Mark 16:15-16; Matthew 28:18-20), who were to pass it on to the ones they taught (2 Timothy 2:2). Every local church is the pillar and support of the truth in their community (1 Timothy 3:15). This is our job. This is our work.

What do we have to offer? Nothing but Jesus Christ and Him crucified (1 Corinthians 12:2). We have no gimmicks, nor carnal appeal. We have only the gospel of Jesus Christ, which is the power of God unto salvation (Romans 1:16). That is enough to convert the lost. That is enough to satisfy the inner man (Matthew 5:6).

We cannot compete with the churches of the world, nor do we wish to. We only want to hold out the cross of the Lord. It is by this that all will be drawn to Him (John 12:32). Let's be satisfied with that.
