Eli's Family: Lack of Discipline

The Bible depicts Eli as a godly man. He judged Israel forty years (1 Samuel 4:18), the next to last ruler of that era. Eli was a priest as well as a judge, serving in the tabernacle at Shiloh (1 Samuel 1:9). His last years were spent as a mentor to young Samuel, who grew to be one of the all-time great characters of Bible history. Eli's death reflected his character, too: news that the ark of the covenant had been captured by the Philistines made him fall off his seat, and he broke his neck and died (1 Samuel 4:18).

Eli's sons were another story. They "were worthless men; they did not know the Lord" (2 Samuel 2:12). They acted as though the priesthood existed for their benefit. Instead of limiting themselves to the prescribed priestly portion of a sacrifice, the breast and right thigh (Leviticus 7:28-34), they took whatever their fork would hold. And they had no qualms about taking the Lord's portion, the fat (Leviticus 3:3-5). They used the priesthood to make themselves fat!

Hophni and Phinehas were as brazen as any priests in history. They threatened anyone who challenged them. They even went so far as to commit fornication with the women who served at the tabernacle (1 Samuel 2:22).

Old Eli rebuked his rebellious sons (1 Samuel 2:22-25). He warned them that they were not only sinning themselves, they were leading others to sin, too. But his rebuke fell on deaf ears. God revealed to Samuel that the day would come when He would cut off Eli's house from priestly service. He explained, "I am about to judge his house forever for the iniquity which he knew, because his sons brought a curse on themselves, and he did not rebuke them" (1 Samuel 3:13).

How could God say Eli did not rebuke his sons when the text records his rebuke? The answer is obvious: Eli did not do enough. The word rendered rebuke literally means to be dim. We might say that Eli did not sufficiently take "a dim view" of what his sons were doing. Yes, he reprimanded them, but when they did not repent he left them in office (Most translations use the term restrain). Actually, what Hophni and Phinehas did deserved death. God accused Eli of honoring them above Him (1 Samuel 2:29).

Personal devotion to God and a good example are musts if we are to bring up our children in the way of

the Lord. But more is needed. Persistent misbehavior calls for corrective discipline. Hopefully, a rebuke or mild punishment will suffice. When it does not, God clearly expects us to do whatever is necessary. May He bless us with wisdom and courage.

They Do Not Know How To Blush

The children of Judah were far gone in the days of Jeremiah the Prophet. As God prepared Jeremiah for his extremely solemn work He adjured him, "As for you, do not pray for this people, or lift up a cry or prayer for them, and do not intercede with me, for I will not hear you (Jeremiah 7:16)."They were so far gone God forbade Jeremiah to pray for their deliverance.

A hallmark of their depravity was not knowing how to blush.

Were they ashamed when they committed abomination? No, they were not at all ashamed; they did not know how to blush. Therefore they shall fall among the fallen; when I punish them, they shall be overthrown, says the LORD. Jeremiah 8:12

"Blushing is the reddening of a person's face due to psychological reasons. It is normally involuntary and triggered by emotional stress, such as that associated with embarrassment, anger, or romantic stimulation."1 The word, "blush," occurs 4 times in the Old Testament, and is a trait approved of and encouraged by God. God designed us to blush and be embarrassed in certain scenarios. He designed us to have a conscience which disapproves of sinful intentions and actions. According to the above quote from Jeremiah, we should blush when we commit an abomination.

Blushing, these days, is seen as a sign of weakness. Successful actors, entertainers, and comedians make money doing things that would cause most people to blush. We wonder how anyone could do or say such

things without blushing. Well, many don't know how to blush because they have worked hard to lose that knowledge. They are often encouraged by others to do so.

Overcoming blushing is the goal of, "Coming out of the closet." Instead of being ashamed of abominable behavior, those who engage in homosexual relations are encouraged by other to not blush but, rather, be proud of it. With respect to killing children, it is in vogue now, among some women, to wear T-shirts that say, "I had an abortion." These are examples of Jeremiah 8:12 in action today.

God designed us to blush when sinning. But blushing while committing even the most egregious sins can be overcome. Not knowing how to blush is an indication of our having moved far away from the humble and contrite spirit God intends us to have, and of our having gotten much too cozy with sin and sinners.

May it never be said of us that we don't know how to blush.
