## Prepare for the Race

The World Police and Fire Games is an event that takes place every two years. Police officers and firefighters from around the world gather at the city chosen to host the games to compete for the typical athletic competitions as well as, contests that are tailored to the specific function of their work. For example, firefighters are timed while carrying various equipment items while wearing heavy attire for their work. The purpose of these competitions is to help them practice the skills they need in their work and to help prepare them when the emergency call comes to them.

In Hebrews 12, the Hebrew writer is reminding Christians that they must prepare for the race they are running. "Therefore, seeing we also are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us" (Hebrews 12:1).

Lay Aside the Weights. The Christian's preparation to run the race of life, the analogy is that in a long distance race, like a marathon. No one would run a long-distance race carrying around extra weight to burden them as they run. In the race of life, many things serve as distractions to our entirely devoting our lives to the service of Christ. Some of these things may not actually be sinful in and of themselves, but they hamper us as we strive to serve. We must honestly look at our lives and see if there are things which are hindering us in being fully committed to serving Christ. It may be in our work, hobbies, etc. We must shed any excess baggage as we run the race of life.

Lay Aside the Sin. The rejection of sin is an absolute must if we are to finish the race with the victory. Sin will destroy us spiritually, taking us away from God. We must stand against sin and do all we can to avoid it. We must not let sin and the weights of life be reattached to us in the race we run.

Let us remember the exhortation of the Hebrew writer to prepare and remain focused on the long-term race, and not be turned away by short-term distractions.

## He Took The Initiative

What has God done for us? That is the question that many ask when confronted with the Gospel. Some choose to never obey because they do not believe God has done anything – others see God as an inactive being who, though He is the apparent impetus behind creation, remains aloof with His creation. But the very first words of Genesis 1:1 speak of an entirely different God. "In the beginning God..." These words tell us of a God who acts, who takes initiative, who creates, speaks, and intimately involves Himself in the affairs of the world beneath Him. The Bible is, in fact, the religion of an initiating god. "Before man existed, God acted. Before man stirs himself to seek God, God has sought man. In the Bible, we do not see man groping after God; we see God reaching after man. Many people visualize a god who sits comfortably on a distant throne, remote, aloof, uninterested, and indifferent to the needs of mortals, until, it may be, they can badger Him into taking action on their behalf. Such a view is wholly false" (Basic Christianity, Stott, p. 11). Long before man thinks to seek God, before it even occurs to him, the Father is actively seeking him. God takes the initiative, leaves His throne, and stoops to our level so that He might lift us up (Romans 5:6-8). "Even when we were dead in our transgressions, [God] made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places" (Ephesians 2:5-6).

What has God done for you lately?

God Has Created You – We seem to forget how very much we need God, even in the most basic way. Without His creative force, we would not exist. We owe our lives to Him. Every time we breathe, every glass of water we drink, every night of sleep, every sunset, every meal – our lives are in His hands. We owe it to Him to seek after Him. For as much as He does for us, is it really that much to worship, love, and obey the Heavenly Father? We could not have created ourselves, and we cannot create anything new now (Ecclesiastes 1:10).

God Has Spoken To You – God will never leave us in the dark without answers. He longs to reveal to us what we need – and it is only our stubborn, unrelenting, dull hearts that prevent us from hearing every word of life (Hebrews 5:11-14). Friends, we need His words. No

words will guide us as His do. In them we have everything we need (2 Timothy 3:16-17). We have insights into the mystery of Christ (Ephesians 3:3-5).

God Has Acted On Your Behalf – "For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost" (Luke 19:10). "It is a trustworthy statement, deserving full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, among whom I am foremost" (1 Timothy 1:15).

Jesus Christ is our propitiation, which means that He is our intercessor before the throne of God (1 John 2:1-2). If that is not enough, then what more would you ask of your Savior?

He died on a cross on our behalf.

He left His place of power and glory to be a human and endure all things we do (Philippians 2:6-7, Hebrews 4:15-16).

To some, the very idea of "unplugging" and spending quiet moments with real people is unnerving. That's sad.

And how much time do we spend in quiet moments with God? Is God some distant Deity or is He your friend and confidant with whom you walk each day? That's not a hard question. Do you know about Him or do you know Him? That's not a hard question either.

The majority has little understanding of how the Creator seeks intimacy with the created (Isaiah 3:7; John 3:16). It's equally sad how a great number of believers

engage in a shallow "Sunday-only" relationship with Him—as if God lives in a box we drag out on the first day of the week. Jesus said, "This is eternal life that they may know Him" (John 17:3). How well do you know Him?

- How many times have you talked on the phone this week versus how many times you have talked with Him?
- How often do you connect with friends on Facebook versus how often you connect with Him in His Book?
- How many quiet moments have you had this week when you allowed yourself to find peace in His presence?

Do you need to unplug? It's amazing how quiet music (or quiet nothing) can calm frazzled minds and restore a sense of calm and well-being. How many times did Jesus get away from the hustle-bustle of the day's busyness and find a quiet place to pray? Luke 5:16 says He did it often. Was He less busy than you? There never has been One with more to do and less time to get it done than Jesus. Yet He made time for what mattered. Do you? Unplug the cord, hit the "OFF" button on the remote, open your Bible, find your prayer closet, and enjoy some quiet moments with the Lord.
