Three Gifts You Never Exchange

Confession time: I know I don't always give "the perfect gift" to my loved ones. My family is so gracious, I've probably missed even more often than I realize.

Even with the best of intentions, I've fallen short in creativity or attention to detail. My second-guessing and insecurity about this is heightened during the holidays, so I save receipts. They can always exchange a gift when it is the wrong color, wrong size, or otherwise unwanted. And there are no hard feelings about it. I've chosen to exchange gifts myself. Haven't we all?

But God is not this sort of gift-giver. Rather, "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and comes down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow of turning" (James 1:17). Our good Father gives us exactly what we need when we need it (Matthew 7:11). There are no genuine exchanges for something better. Better gifts do not exist! In fact, only deception, foolishness, or selfishness would move people to exchange God's good gifts for the devil's inferior knock-offs. Let's notice three of God's gifts that the Bible warns us never to exchange.

Never Exchange the Truth of God for Lies. The wise man advised his son, "Buy the truth, and do not sell it; also wisdom and instruction and understanding" (Proverbs 23:23). The apostle Paul explained that wicked, idolatrous societies have exchanged the gift of truth for lies and reap the disastrous results. "Therefore God also gave them up to uncleanness, in the lusts of their hearts, to dishonor their bodies among themselves, who exchanged the truth of God for the lie, and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen" (Romans 1:24-25). God's word is truth (John 17:17) and Scripture is the word of God (2 Timothy 3:16-17). Perhaps we fail to recognize that every word from God is a gift from Him, the gift of truth. The Bible is a good and perfect gift from God.

Never Exchange The Faith for Worldly Philosophies. There is only one faith, one gospel, and one doctrine of Jesus Christ (Ephesians 4:5; Galatians 1:6-9; 2 John 9-10). Paul exhorted the young minister Timothy to guard the faith and to avoid exchanging it for fashionable worldly philosophies. "O Timothy! Guard what was committed to your trust, avoiding the profane and idle babblings and contradictions of what is falsely called knowledge – by professing it some have strayed concerning the faith" (1 Timothy 6:20-21). Likewise, Christians at Colosse were warned, "Beware lest anyone cheat you through philosophy and empty deceit, according to the tradition of men, according to the basic principles of the world, and not according to Christ" (Colossians 2:8). Let's respect Christianity as it is revealed in Scripture and not attempt to wed it to worldly philosophies or discard it in favor of man-made religions. The faith is a good and perfect gift from God.

Never Exchange Salvation for Sin. The greatest gift that God gives us is salvation in Jesus Christ. "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 6:23). This gift is priceless because it is only obtainable by the precious death of Jesus Christ (Matthew 16:26; 1 Peter 1:18-21). Yet temptation often offers us something in exchange for our salvation. The Hebrew writer warns Christians to view temptation to sin like Moses did—these things are only "passing pleasures" and not worth exchanging our eternal reward (Hebrews 11:24-26). Furthermore, learn from Esau—not to be shortsighted by the selfishness of the flesh and fall into the trap of exchanging our birthright of salvation (Hebrews 12:15-17). Salvation is a good and perfect gift from God (Ephesians 2:8-10).

I don't always give "the perfect gift" to my loved ones, but God gives only perfect gifts and he doesn't include gift receipts. The devil tries to fool us into thinking we can make an exchange for something better. But remember that no matter how sin wraps the package, it only contains error, apostasy, and death (James 1:14-15). Never exchange God's good gifts for that.

daily, whether those things were so" (Acts 17:11). How wonderful it would be if we could get all men today to receive the word with "all readiness of mind" as did these. Let's note what these individuals did that made it possible for them to be described as more noble than the Jews of Thessalonica.

First, Luke notes that they were receptive to the word. They had not closed their minds to anything that may not be in agreement with what they wanted to believe or already believed. Many today refuse to listen to anything that may be contrary to their previous convictions, however these were eager to hear what Paul had to say. Also, the Bereans wanted to make sure that what they received was in harmony with the truth of God's word. They searched thescriptures to see whether the things taught were true. I am afraid that many today do not really care whether what they believe is in harmony with the scriptures. They have their minds made up as to what they are going to believe or not believe and have closed their minds to anything that may be contrary to these preconceived beliefs.

The person who closes his mind to the teaching of God's word or refuses to listen to that which may be contrary to what he already believes is wrong even if what he believes is not. His attitude is not what it should be and he is believing what he believes, not because it is the truth, but because it is what he wants to believe. The lover of truth will always be ready to study and investigate to be sure he is doing that which is pleasing to God. He will never close his mind or refuse to listen to the teaching of God's word even if it demands a change on his part. What about you? Are you such a lover of truth? Can you say that you will receive the word with "all readiness of mind"?

Fix Your Eyes on Jesus

"Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us also lay aside every encumbrance and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith..." (Hebrews 12:1-2).

The Example

Jesus is the author of salvation. The Greek word used here "primarily signifies one who takes a lead in, or provides the first occasion of, anything" (Vine). Some suggest pioneer or trail-blazer is the idea. Jesus opens the way to God because He is the way (Hebrews 10:19-20; John 14:6). Jesus is also the perfecter of faith. In Him faith found its perfect expression. He completed the faith by carrying out God's plan, and He is also able to bring our faith to its complete end.

Other Examples

As we run our race we should rightly be able to look to each other for instructive and encouraging examples. While elders (1 Peter 5:3) and preachers (1 Timothy 4:12) are especially charged with leading by example, every disciple ought to be able to say with Paul, "Be imitators of me, just as I also am of Christ"(1 Corinthians 11:1). Even the best disciples, however, have their flaws. Never make the mistake of judging the greatness or power or value of Jesus by the weakness of His followers. Fix your eyes on Jesus!

An Illustration

While Jesus, Peter, James, and John were away on a mountain to pray, a man brought his demon-possessed boy to the other apostlesto be healed (Mark 9:14-29). The demon was causing seizures and self-destructive behavior. Despite having cast out demons previously (see 6:13), this time the apostles failed. The father was crushed. When Jesus arrived, the father explained the situation to Him and pled, "But if You can do anything, take pity on us and help us!" (v. 22). Due to the disciples' failure, this man who had come in faith was now not so sure.

Jesus picked up on his "if You can." "And Jesus said to him, 'If you can?' All things are possible to him who believes" (v. 23). The humble, honest, struggling father immediately responded, "I do believe; help my unbelief" (v. 24).

Jesus cast out the demon. The boy was cured at once. The Lord explained to the apostles that they had faileddue to lack of faith (Matthew 17:20). He urged them to pray more (Mark 9:29). And everyone involved learned the valuable lesson, "fix your eyes on Jesus."
