Where Is My Head Today?

It seems that no matter the age, people are very busy today. Because of this self-made situation, many find themselves fighting the battle of staying focused on the important things. Let us first establish that being busy is not a bad thing at all. Actually we can find teaching in the Bible that supports the idea of staying busy, "And besides they learn to be idle, wandering about from house to house, and not only idle but also gossips and busybodies, saying things which they ought not" (1Timothy 5:13). "In all labor there is profit, But idle chatter leads only to poverty" (Proverbs 14:23), "Laziness casts one into a deep sleep, and an idle person will suffer hunger" (Proverbs 19:15).

So how does one stay focused on the important things, while juggling so many others?

First, one must take time to identify the "important" things. This may sound easy; however, this is not always an easy task. So many people define their goals and priorities very vaguely and not too well thought out. For someone to accomplish a goal successfully they must make a strategic plan and stay determined until the goal is accomplished. This takes attention, determination, and focus.

As it should be, many who have committed their life to the Lord would quickly answer that they have made a home in Heaven their number one priority. However, the decisions they make and the way they actually live may not show it to be a top priority. It is written, that those following Christ must *"lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. For consider Him who endured such hostility from sinners against Himself, lest you become weary and discouraged in your souls*" (Hebrews 12:1-3). Yes, this is a race, possibly a very long race. We have been instructed to eliminate anything that may hinder us from finishing the race. In the way the apostle Paul describes the race to the Corinthians we can see the importance and urgency that is needed to accomplish the goal. "Do you not know that those who run in a race all run, but one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may obtain it" (1Corinthians 9:24).

Jesus also had much to say about the urgency and focus needed to achieve the goal. In one teaching moment He said the following, "Watch therefore, for you do not know when the master of the house is coming—in the evening, at midnight, at the crowing of the rooster, or in the morning—lest, coming suddenly he find you sleeping. And what I say to you, I say to all: Watch!" (Mark 13:35-37). As we can see, Jesus directs all that desire to follow Him need to prepare now. He stresses that procrastination is a bad idea. He points out that one needs a sense of urgency, and He says that this must be the top focus and priority one has.

All who want to inherit the kingdom must take the time to meditate (focus) on what is above and not what is here below (Philippians 4:8). How can anyone who seriously wants to have a home in Heaven not have this goal on the mind each and every day? This means to set time aside to work at it each day. What is interpreted when one reads the following scripture, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind" (Matthew 22:37)? Hopefully, the clear message is that it will take more than just saying, "I want to go to Heaven." Hopefully, the message is clear that it takes a daily commitment which will include, time, energy, focus, and urgency.

Jesus said, "If you love me, keep my commandments" (John 14:15). He has directed us to follow the Father's words, commit ourselves to a life of faithfulness and godly living. He has urged all to do these things now, before it is everlastingly too late.

With these things in mind, we should be asking ourselves several times a day, "Where is my head today?" This alone will help to keep the number one goal (a home in Heaven) in the forefront of the mind where it needs to reside at all times. Every decision should be made considering this goal. If a choice draws one further from the goal, it is not worth doing. Decisions should be made to get one closer to the ultimate goal. For it is written, "For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul?" (Mark 8:36).

What's the Point of Miracles?

"Points of Orientation" are positions from which other positions develop. For example, if you believe miracles are impossible, then automatically all "prophecies" occurred after the fact.

I heard a preacher state concerning a miracle of Jesus, "He first miraculously solved a social ill, and then taught the gospel." The implication was, "the church needs to solve social ills as Jesus did, and then preach the gospel." Is that why Jesus performed miracles? Did Jesus heal to cure social maladies?

There is no denying Jesus felt compassion which is why He healed (Matthew 14:13-14). Compassion was the cause, the starting point emotionally, but not the theological end. These are reasons Jesus demonstrated the divine powers:

- 1. Healing established His authority (i.e., confirmed the word) (John 3:2; Hebrews 2:3-4).
- 2. Miracles were a physical manifestation of spiritual salvation by faith (same word used for both sozo) (Matthew 9:22).
- 3. Signs foreshadowed new creation, the physical reversal of the curses of Genesis 3 (John 2,11).
- 4. Casting our demons demonstrated His kingly power over the devil's realm (Mark 1:7-13).

If Jesus came to solve social ills, then why didn't he go around giving money to the poor, building schools, and hospitals? Now don't get me wrong, sharing as individuals is an outgrowth of loving God and our neighbors; and we can't practice pure religion without helping the outcasts of society. However, that doesn't appear to be the purpose of miracles.

Consider this:

- Jesus established His authority, and once established it does not need confirmation again. That purpose for miracles has ceased.
- 2. Jesus demonstrated His power to heal and forgive already. That purpose for miracles has ceased.
- 3. Jesus brought in new creation and we are part. That purpose for miracles has ceased.
- 4. Jesus defeated Satan and is sitting on the throne. That purpose for miracles has ceased.

However, social ills such as poverty, sicknesses, and such are still with us - "the poor you will always have with you" (Matthew 26:11). If Jesus performed miracles to solve society's problems, then don't we still need the ability to perform miracles today? And yet, we can't. So... maybe Jesus didn't "first miraculously solved a social ill". Maybe miracles were pointing to something higher, a different point of orientation, that Jesus is Lord, Savior, Creator, and King.

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But Abel Is Dead

In Genesis 4 we read about Cain and Abel, two sons of Adam and Eve. After just a few verses of the chapter Abel dies but Cain lives on to have a wife and progeny and to build a city. So Cain is the more successful of the two brothers, right?

Anyone familiar with the Biblical record about these two men knows that Cain's outliving Abel does not mean that Cain was better off than Abel. For one thing, Cain also died in time, so longer physical life is not endless life.

Recollections of Cain tell of his having murdered his brother and the curse that he bore as a result of his sin and lack of contrition (Genesis 4; 1 John 3:12; see also Jude 11). Cain remains through thousands of years an example of unrighteousness and impenitence.

Abel on the other hand is recalled among the faithful (Hebrews 11:4). Cain outlived Abel and had more experiences on earth, but that has very little meaning when all is said and done. Jesus said, "For what profit is it to a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul? Or what will a man give in exchange for his soul?" (Matthew 16:26).

We may live a long life or a short life on earth, but what matters is whether we live by faith in God. That type of life requires that we learn His word and surrender to its message.
