Peace in the Christian's Life

"Peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you, Let not your heart be troubled neither let it be afraid." — (John 14:27)

At times, life can be so chaotic and stressful. The world around us may seem to be falling apart, and nothing appears to have order. However, during these uncertain, chaotic, and stressful times God's people should stand out as beacons of peace. Jesus says that he gives peace, but not the peace of the world. How can we have and be beacons of peace in times of uncertainty, chaos, and stress?

Understand Peace.


Peace is defined as "quiet, calm, tranquility, harmony in relationships." As children of God, we should seek peace in our life. We should pursue peace with ourselves and with others. In summing up the Christian's responsibilities, Peter says, "Let him seek peace and pursue it" (1 Peter 3:11b). In seeking for peace, we must know the things which will disrupt peace and steer our lives away from those things. Things that disrupt peace are the attitudes and dispositions of sin or that lead us to sin. There is turmoil in the home, financial upheavals, relationship struggles, physical and emotional oppression. All of these things will destroy the peace we should have in life.

How To Achieve and Maintain Peace.

Determine to Live and Pursue a Righteous Life. A righteous life is a life characterized by being upright, moral, and virtuous. It is a life that is governed by God and His word since He is the decider of what is right and what is wrong. My attitude, disposition, and treatment of others will be according to the plan God has given to man. It is a life that follows the pattern of Jesus' life. It is a life that "love God with all your heart, with all your soul, and will all your mind" (Matthew 22:38; 26:36-38). It is a life that "loves your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 5:44; Luke 23:34-38). When we come to live and pursue a righteous life, we will have peace.

Seek and Pursue Restoration. Man does not live a sinless life. Man sins and comes short of God's mark (Romans 3:23; 1 John 1:8). However, man does not have to remain in sin with no hope because of the failures of the past. Thanks be to God for the gift of His Son, Jesus Christ, and the sacrifice He gave for our forgiveness of sin. Man can receive the forgiveness of sin by coming into contact with the blood of Jesus that brought forgiveness. Man needs to seek and pursue the forgiveness of sin, by doing what God's word tells him to do (Mark 16:16; Acts 2:38, etc.). When one does what God's word says, he is not earning his salvation but is merely doing the good works that he has been told him to do (Ephesians 2:10). The cleansing power and the grace of God will now cleanse him from his sins. He is now at peace with God. There is no longer an estrangement between him and God, and as he continues to live within the law of God, then the peace of God will remain with him. He will have the peace and the promises that God desires for man to have.

Jesus is the provider of peace. Let us live our lives in this world, but not lose focus on the peace we have due to all the chaos around us. The world will not know peace until the world comes to know Jesus. Let us live our lives and show to the world the peace that can be achieved and maintained.



The Grandest Name

I want to ask you a question. Why be a Christian? Many times, people reason that being a Christian requires very much of one. This is true. Being a Christian requires dedication and commitment to God and His will. Being a Christian requires sacrifice. It is not the easiest life one could live. As one looks at these things, he may be tempted to rephrase the question. Why would anyone want to be a Christian?

One reason to be a Christian is to wear the grandest name given among men whereby we must be saved (Acts 4:12). Let me ask you, how does it feel to wear the name "American"? But may I emphasize that this grandeur and glory is multiplied again and again when we think about wearing the name "Christian." In James 2:7, speaking of those who persecuted Christians, James said, "Do not they blaspheme that worthy (honorable) name by which ye are called?" We want to emphasize, the name "Christian" is a worthy name! The name Christian is an honorable name.

Someone may ask, "Why"? Some believe the name Christian was given to Christians by their enemies, in derision. They tell us the name was given as an object of ridicule. This is not the case. In Acts 11:26, we read, "...the disciples were called Christians first at Antioch." The words, *"were called"* in this verse are from a word meaning, "a divine calling".

So, according to the passage, God was the One who did the calling. J. H. Thayer, in defining the words, *"were called"* says, "to give divine command or admonition, to teach from heaven, to be divinely admonished, instructed." So, this calling was not by their enemies in derision or ridicule but rather, it was given to them by God (Isaiah 62:2). When we wear the name Christian, we wear the name God gave to His people. It is a shame that many people today wear a name in religion that has come from man and not named by God. When we are Christians, we can wear the grandest, greatest name given among men.

This is the name in which the apostle Peter strongly affirms how we can glorify God (1 Peter 4:16). The apostle Paul said that the name of Christ is above every name (Phil 2:9). He zealously and earnestly sought to persuade King Agrippa to become a Christian (Acts 26:28). We must realize that there is something in a name. We should gladly wear the name God has given us. In religion, we need nothing more, nothing less and nothing else.
