Who Will Follow Jesus?

"If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me" — (Luke 9:23)

How challenging are these words of Jesus? Jesus is calling for disciples, but He wants disciples who are fully committed to following Him. We often want to "cherry-pick" the commands and scriptures that we believe Jesus is referring to, but Jesus simply says that we are to deny ourselves and follow Him. Jesus is not merely speaking of a momentary decision, but rather a genuine commitment to living each day for Him. To be the disciple, let us consider three things.

Be a Learner. The word "disciple" is defined as "a follower or pupil of a teacher, leader, or philosopher." A disciple then is one who is continually learning from his teacher. As disciples of Christ, we are to be people who are always reading, looking, studying, and learning more about Jesus and the things that He taught His disciples. A disciple is not equal or above his teacher. Jesus said, "A disciple is not above his teacher, but everyone who is perfectly trained will be like his teacher" (Luke 6:40). It is clear disciples are learning from their teachers and are taught and trained to be like their teacher. This is not done overnight or in a spasmodic way, but with purpose and diligence.

Deny Self. Jesus calls for His disciples to deny themselves. A disciple is not going to be one who looks to the culture, friends, or the political culture around them to decide what to do. It may be that the right decision may have costs in this life. Still, a disciple will know that the real cost is making a decision that cost him a relationship with Christ. Jesus tells His disciples that the costs are high, but so are the rewards. Far too often, we want to dismiss any cost of being a disciple of Jesus, but Jesus never did that, and neither should we. Many times there are costs in life in being a disciple. However, the costs in this life of being a disciple have no comparison with the eternal costs of not being a disciple. Paul put it this way, "For I consider that the sufferings of the present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us" (Romans 8:18).

Daily Endeavor. Jesus tells His disciples to "take up your cross daily." Jesus knows that disciples will need to do this daily if they are to be successful. Too often, people want to be disciples, but do not want to be a disciple daily. It is tough, if not impossible, to be very good at anything if you are not committed to doing it. Jesus knows this. He knows that it must be a daily walk if you are going to complete it. The daily learning, training, and applying the practices of Jesus to our lives will help us when the difficult days come. Yes, Jesus knows that the difficult days will come, so He says to do it daily. If you do not, the temptations, trials, and sufferings will come when you are not ready, and you will fall. Determine to be the disciple that will daily take up the cross and follow Jesus.

Will you follow Jesus? E. E. Hewitt asks in a song

we sing:

"Who will follow Jesus?

Standing for the right,

Holding up His banner

In the thickest fight?

Listening for His orders,

Ready to obey,

Who will follow Jesus,

Serving Him today?
May we all reply, "I am on the Lord"s side; Master, here am I?"

Pictures of Jesus

"We wish to see Jesus" (John 12:21). Have you ever seen a picture of Jesus? You have probably seen some representation that had come from the mind of men. The reality is that no one today knows what Jesus looked like while He lived in the flesh. Nevertheless, if you read the Bible, you will see the many ways Jesus is pictured throughout the word of God. Some latch on to one of these images to the exclusion of the others. Let us consider some of the pictures used to portray Jesus that we might have a more "complete picture" of our Lord.

He Is Pictured As The Great Shepherd of the Sheep: The Messianic prophet Isaiah said that Jesus

would, "Feed His flock like a shepherd; He will gather the lambs with His arm, And carry them in His bosom, And gently lead those who are with young" (Isaiah 40:11). Jesus spoke of Himself as a Shepherd in John 10:9-15, noting that, as the Shepherd, He knows His sheep, guides them, feeds them, and would lay down His life for them. Jesus is truly the "Chief Shepherd" of His sheep (1 Peter 5:4). See Jesus as the great shepherd of the sheep!

He Is Pictured As The Lamb of God: Though Jesus is the Shepherd of the sheep, He is also pictured as the Lamb of God. John, in the Revelation, recorded these words, "For the Lamb who is in the midst of the throne will shepherd them and lead them to living fountains of waters" (Revelation 7:17). As a prophet of God, John the baptist saw Jesus in this way: "The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, 'Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29). Jesus is the Lamb of God whose blood was shed that our sins might be taken away. See Jesus as the precious lamb of God!

He Is Pictured As The King of Kings: The angel told Mary the child she would bear, "Will be great, and will be called the Son of the Highest; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David" (Luke 1:32). Jesus Himself attested to this fact when Pilate asked if He was "a king." Jesus responded, "You say rightly that I am a King" (John 18:37). Jesus has been given "all authority...in heaven and on earth" (Matthew 28:18). Therefore, "at the name of Jesus every knee should bow" (Philippians 2:10). Jesus is the "King of kings" (1 Timothy 6:15). See Jesus as the King of kings and Lord of lords!

He Is Pictured As The Righteous Judge: Paul wrote of Jesus as "the righteous Judge" (2 Timothy 4:8). Jesus will one day execute Judgment as the Father has committed all Judgment of Him (John 5:22). He will judge using the standard of His word (John 12:48). No one will escape this Judgment, "For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ" (2 Corinthians 5:10; Hebrews 9:27). See Jesus as the righteous Judge to whom we must give account!

He Is Pictured As The Friend of Mankind: Jesus identified Himself as a friend by stating, "Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends" (John 15:13). The evidence of this friend found in Jesus is seen in His sacrifice. Have you shown yourself

friendly to the greatest friend you could ever know? Jesus tells you the way to do so. He said, "You are My friends if you do whatever I command you" (John 15:14). See Jesus as the greatest friend mankind has ever known! Seeing Jesus, what will you do? May you listen to His voice, find salvation through His sacrifice, submit to Him as your King, prepare for His righteous Judgment, and be His friend as you obey Him!
