# Beyond the Grave

"I Am the resurrection and the life, He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?" (John 11:25-26).

When Jesus heard of the death of His dear friend Lazarus said, "Our friend Lazarus sleeps, but I go that I may wake him up" (John 11:11). As Jesus came to Lazarus' grave, Jesus met his sister, Martha, and told a truth that needed to be remembered, that He is "the resurrection and the life" (John 11:25). Jesus is not teaching that believers in Him will continue to physically live forever but that there is life beyond the grave. Seeing beyond the grave seems to be one of the biggest problems people have. The struggles of life disturb us because we fail to remember what is beyond the grave. As people of faith, life problems would fade into insignificance as we view life beyond the grave. Let us consider what is beyond the grave.

# There Will Be A Judgment.

The Bible says concerning death, "Then the dust will return to the earth as it was; And the spirit will return to God who gave it" (Ecclesiastes 12:7). In Hebrews 9:27, we read, "And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment." It is clear from the scriptures that after this life, the spirit of man will return to God for judgment. In this judgment, man will not be judged on what people thought of him but on how he lived following the Lord's will. In Romans 14:12, "So then each of us shall give account of himself to God." In 2 Corinthians 5:10, "For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive the things done in the body, according to that he has done, whether good or bad." Beyond the grave, we will face God to be judged according to His will (Matthew 7:21-24; John 12:48).

# What Does This Mean?

The question may well be asked, "What does this mean?" It means that really what matters is how man's life is viewed by God. In Jesus' day, He spoke of those that believed in Him but would not confess Him "For they loved the praise of men more than the praise of God" (John 12:43). Today, it is still the same; some cannot see beyond the grave because of the praise, prestige, and position of honor that they hold among men.

The fate of such people is best seen in the sermon on the mount. Jesus pictures the judgment scene and says, "Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works?" (Matthew 7:22). He says that some will have done many wonderful things in the eyes of men. On this side of the grave, they looked exceptional to men. But notice Jesus'response, "And then I will profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity" (Matthew 7:23). We must learn to see beyond the grave and to view our lives as God views them.

### How Would God View Your Life?

Would God be pleased or not? We must understand that it does matter what we do on this side of the grave. And what we do or do not do will determine where we spend eternity on the other side of the grave. Each one needs to learn to view this life as a preparation for the life beyond the grave. May we learn to live in this life with the view of eternity that we may enjoy the paradise

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# First Called "Disciples"

"... and the disciples were first called Christians in Antioch" (Acts 11:26). Luke records that disciples were first called Christians here some 13 years AFTER the day of Pentecost recorded in Acts 2. So what were Christians called during that period of time? Well the answer may be obvious, but the lessons from that answer may not be to most.

While we learn that they were first called Christians at Antioch... they were first called "Disciples". The term disciple means "a follower of." Therefore, if all Christians are disciples, that means all Christians are followers of Christ. This harmonizes perfectly with what 1 John 2:3-6 says, "By this we know that we have come to know Him, if we keep His commandments. The one who says, 'I have come to know Him,' and does not keep His commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him; but whoever keeps His word, in him the love of God has truly been perfected. By this we know that we are in Him: the one who says he abides in Him ought himself to walk in the same manner as He walked."This also corresponds perfectly with what Jesus said as He preached, "If you continue in My word, then you are truly disciples of Mine; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free" (John 8:31-32).

Learning that they were disciples we verify that one becomes a Christian by being baptized. According to the command of Jesus, one was to become a disciple by baptism, "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you..." (Matthew 28:19-20). Furthermore, we know that being baptized is a following of Christ from death into a new life of service to God the Father, "Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life" (Romans 6:4). The implication of the "new life" is not that we continue in sin that grace might abound (modernly referred to as "once saved always saved"), but instead is a call to godliness, "For the death that He died, He died to sin once for all; but the life that He lives, He lives to God. Even so consider yourselves to be dead to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus. Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its lusts, and do not go on presenting the members of your body to sin as instruments of unrighteousness; but present yourselves to God as those alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness to God" (Romans 6:10-13).

If one wants to be a Christian, a Disciple, a Follower of Christ, then they must by the very definition of the word, follow Him. They must follow His walk (Romans 6:4-10), commands (Matthew 28:19-20), and example (Matthew 3:13-17). There is no such thing as an unbaptized Christian because there is no such thing as an unbaptized Disciple. Not according to the words of Jesus anyway. Remember John 8:31-32? If we are truly disciples of Christ then you will know the truth and it will make you free. What is the truth? "... the word of truth, the gospel" (Colossians 1:5). What is the gospel? "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation. He who has believed and has been baptized shall be saved..." (Mark 16:15-16). And what does baptism free (save) you from? Sin (Acts 2:38; 22:16) and Death (Romans 6:17-23).

When we understand what it truly means to be a "Disciple", then we learn that we can't be a Christian without being one.
