# "It Is Finished!"

"So when Jesus had received the sour wine, He said, 'It is finished!' And bowing His head, He gave up His spirit." – (John 10:30)

How many Fridays had come and gone as the Jews prepared for the Sabbath Day? But this Friday was a different day. It was a day filled with a rush to take Jesus of Nazareth, who was arrested during the night, charged, tried, and set on crucifying Him. It may be that a casual observer would have given no attention to the things that were done. However, it was on this day that Jesus fulfilled the plan to save man. As Jesus was hanging on the cross, He spoke His last words in His earthly ministry, exclaiming, "It is finished!" It is in these words we see the ruling passion of His life. Jesus stated that the work He came to do was complete and was a source of satisfaction. What is it that was finished in Jesus' death?

# The Old Testament Types were Finished.

To fully understand the Old Testament, we must have the New Testament to see the types and shadows of the Old Testament. The book of Leviticus is more clearly seen in the book of Hebrews as a commentary to it. In the sacrifices, how and where did they originate? Who instituted them? What was the purpose? These are things that the law required, but there was a plan for a better covenant with better promises (Hebrews 8:6-ff). All of this was completed as Jesus finished His work, fulfilling the law and nailing it to the cross (Colossians 2:14).

# Christ's Suffering was Over.

John declared, "we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth" (John 1:14). Jesus came to earth and lived as a man. In His life, He suffered in many ways. Jesus suffered hunger, thirst, weariness, and pain. He experienced the loss of loved ones, loneliness, sorrows for sins of others, and insults. We see Jesus at the grave of Lazarus, where He was sorrowing with the family and friends (John 11:33-36). In the garden of Gethsemane, we see the anguish that He bore as He faced the cross that was before Him (Matthew 26:36-46). We see Jesus' lamenting over Jerusalem and their rejection of Him (Matthew

23:37-38). The Jews at His trial calling out to Pilate, "Let Him be crucified!" (Matthew 27:22). Even among His closest associates in His ministry, one of them, Judas, betrayed Him. Just before Judas betrayed Him, Jesus said, "Now My soul is troubled, and what shall I say? 'Father, save Me from this hour?' But for this purpose, I came to this hour. Father, glorify Your name" (John 12:27). Yes, Jesus suffered much in His life on earth. The sufferings He bore on the cross are almost unfathomable. Jesus did not stop short of completing the plan of God even while experiencing great suffering. It was perhaps this that caused Jesus to exclaim from the cross, "It is finished!" The suffering and battle over sin were over.

# The Work of Redemption was Done.

Jesus' work in coming to earth was to save man. The law was given to man by Moses, but the law would not save man. Man would keep the law and offer the sacrifices for sin, but the sins were not forgiven. There was no escape from the penalty of sin under the law. John tells us, "For the law was given through Moses, but grace and truth came through Jesus Christ" (John 1:17). Jesus came and offered His life as the atonement for sin (Romans 3:23-25) and redeeming man. Jesus did not stop short in doing His work of saving man. He completed it, and it was finished at the cross. What a glorious thought to be redeemed!

Jesus finished and completed His life in fulfilling the scriptures and suffering whatever was before Him to complete the work of redemption. The question is: Will we be as committed to following the teachings of scriptures to please God and do the things to avail ourselves of the salvation that is in Christ?

"For since there is jealousy and quarreling among you, are you not worldly? Are you not acting like mere men?" (1 Corinthians 3:3).

Life is too short to waste on selfishness. Love "does not seek its own" (1 Corinthians 13:5). "Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind regard one another as more important than yourselves; do not merely look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others" (Philippians 2:3-4).

Life is too short to waste on living in the past. "Do not say, 'Why is it that the former days were better than these?' For it is not from wisdom that you ask about this" (Ecclesiastes 7:10).

Life is too short to waste on worry. "For this reason I say to you, do not worry about your life, as to what you will eat; nor for your body, as to what you will put on. For life is more than food, and the body more than clothing...And which of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life's span?" (Luke 11:22-25).

Life is too short to waste on sin. "He who would love life and see good days, let him refrain his tongue from evil, and his lips from speaking deceit. Let him turn away from evil and do good; let him seek peace and pursue it" (1 Peter 3:10-11).
