Do Not Be Conformed, But Transformed

"And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God." (Romans 12:2)

In Romans 12, Paul is exhorting Christians to respond to God's mercy in the forgiveness of our sins and live lives that are an acceptable offering to God. In verse 2, Paul writes that we are to "not be conformed to the world." Paul is stressing that Christians are not to be molded or fashioned to the moral system in which they live. It is hard to live in the flesh and not conform to the things around us, but Jesus came and showed us how to not conform. Let us consider ways that will help us to be nonconformists and transformed into the image of Christ.

BeAware. Be aware of what are your strengths and weaknesses. Do not allow yourself to be put into a situation that will hurl temptations at you. Be mindful of the things that are going on around you. Do not become so inoculated to society so that we do not even know that we are conforming our standards to the world and its standards. We need to remember that John wrote, "Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world — the lust of the flesh, the lusts of the eyes, and the pride of life — is not of the Father but is of the world." (1 John 2:15-16). When we passively go through life without considering the evil that is all around us, it is a sign that we are becoming conformed instead of transformed. Be watchful, alert, and take time to meditate on the things of God.

Keep Your Heart Focused on the Things of God. The key to keeping our hearts focused is to spend time reading and meditating on the word of God. The blessed man in Psalm 1 is keeping his heart focused on the word of God. He does not walk in the counsel of the ungodly. Instead, his delight is found in meditating upon the law of the Lord. The blessed man here is a good picture of a man seeking to transform his life to God's will. He is not spending his time meditating on man's schemes and how to get the upper hand in this life. He is not conforming to the world. He is keeping his heart focused on the right things, the things of God. The heart is the very core of who and what you are, so let us give our attention to keeping our hearts with the proper focus. Remember, the psalmist said, "How can a young man cleanse his way? By taking heed according to Your word" (Psalm 119:9). Let us take heed to the word with all of our hearts.

Keep Our Lives Pure. Paul wrote, "whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, what things are lovely whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy — meditate on these things" (Philippians 4:8). The importance of our thinking cannot be overstressed when we are considering not being conformed but transformed. A close relationship with Christ will require that my thinking will be pure. It will be the kind of thinking that will allow my heart to be transformed. It will cause my heart to be uncontaminated and pure. Let us let our thinking be the kind of thinking that will transform us to be more like Christ.

Let us live our lives to God in sacrifice to Him for that great love and mercy He has shown us. May we ever be striving to transform our lives to what He desires for them to be. May we guard our lives against being conformed to the world we live in.

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Tests of Fellowship

Often the phrase test of fellowship is used to indicate differences between groups which prevent them from working and worshiping together. While Scriptural judgments of others are necessary (John 7:24), the real test of fellowship should begin personally and internally (2 Corinthians 13:5). Fellowship between individuals is dependent on each one's relationship with the Lord. The first letter from the apostle John provides several practical "tests." If we are concerned about our relationships with the Lord, we should ask ourselves the following questions:

The Truth Test: Am I believing and practicing the truth? God is Light, and to have fellowship with Him, we must walk in the light. Those who say they are righteous yet walk in darkness are liars and do not practice the truth. But, Christians who walk in the Light are being cleansed by the blood of Christ (1 John 1:5–7). If we transgress God's law and walk in darkness, we have the devil as our father (1 John 3:4–10). But, if we keep the Lord's commandments and walk in the same manner He walked, "the love of God is truly perfected in us" (1 John 2:3–6).

The Sin Test: Am I acknowledging and confessing my sins? The unsaved first come to God in baptism to contact the blood of Christ (Acts 22:16; Revelation 1:5), but we who are Christians are washed clean by the saving blood when we walk in the Light and acknowledge and confess our sins (1 John 1:9). To claim sinlessness is to implicate God as a liar and show the absence of his word in our hearts (1 John 1:8, 10). We must, like the sin-struck Simon the Sorcerer, repent and pray for forgiveness (Acts 8:22). When we acknowledge our transgressions, pray to God asking for Him to cleanse us, and continue to examine ourselves, the Lord "is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9; Psalm 19:12).

The Love Test: Am I loving my brothers and sisters in Christ? John says those who claim to walk in the Light yet do not love their brothers and sisters in Christ are still in darkness (1 John 2:9, 11). This is a recurring theme in John. He writes, "Little children, let us not love with word and with tongue, but in deed and truth" (2:18). "The one who does not love does not know God, for God is love.... Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.... If someone says, 'I love God,' and hates his brother, he is a liar; for the one who does not love his brother whom he has seen, cannot love God whom he has not seen. And this commandment we have from Him, that the one who loves God should love his brother also" (4:8, 11, 20–21). Fellowship with God is dependent on our love for his children.

No doubt, we all want to be in—and stay in—fellowship with God and be ready for the Judgment? We must, therefore, make sure we are passing these tests of fellowship—"The Truth Test,""The Sin Test," and "The Love Test." Our eternal destiny depends on it!
