We Walk By Faith

"For we walk by faith, and not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7).

Paul describes the Christian's life as a walk by faith. Faith is a necessary ingredient for anyone who wants to please God (Hebrews 11:6), and the Christian should desire to do that in his life. Let us consider what Paul is saying and make sure we are walking by faith.

What is Walking By Faith?

What does Paul mean when he says, "We walk by faith?" First, Paul does not mean that one should simply be sincere and believe what he is doing is right. Sincerity is essential in all that we do, but more is involved in walking by faith than just doing what one believes is right. In Romans 10:17, we learn that "faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." Then to walk by faith is to walk by the word of God, not by what man might believe or think. The psalmist speaking of the word says it is "a lamp unto my feet and a light to my pathway" (Psalm 119:105). The word of God is what is to guide us, directing our steps so that we might understand what the will of the Lord is. And then, as we live according to God's will, we will walk by faith. Paul stressing the importance of faith in our walk as Christians says, "Whatsoever is not of faith is sin" (Romans 14:23). All we do in service to God must be by faith.

Faith Must Be Active; Alive

Knowing the will of God is not enough if we are going to walk by faith. Our faith must be active and obedient if we walk "by faith and not by sight." In the sermon on the mount, Jesus mentions those who are sincere and know the Lord's will but have failed to do the will of God. In Matthew 7:21-23, Jesus said, "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven; but he who does the will of my Father in heaven. Many will say to Me in that day, 'Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name?' And then will I declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness.""

To be accepted, Jesus shows man must not just say I believe, but do the Father's will. We must obey what God has given to us through the word of God. Paul writes, "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good works" (2 Timothy 3:16-17).

In James 2, James says that a living and acceptable faith will be active and working. James writes, "What does it profit, my brethren, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can faith save him? If a brother or sister is naked and destitute of daily food, and one of you says to them, 'Depart in peace, be warmed and filled,' but you do not give them the things which are needed for the body, what does it profit? Thus also faith by itself, if it does have not works, is dead" (James 2:14-17). Faith that is living and acceptable acts upon the faith one has, not just saying "I believe."James stated that even the devils had faith and tremble (James 2:19), but obviously, they were not walking by faith as God desires. Instead, if one is going to walk by faith, then he will do what God desires.

Our love for God brings about the activation of faith. Paul told the Galatians, "For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision avails anything, but faith working through love" (Galatians 5:6). As we by faith learn the love that God had for us (John 3:16; Romans 5:8), this should move us by faith to want to please Him and do His will.

Do We Walk By Faith?

Do we have the confidence that Paul expressed in the Corinthians because of our walk by faith? In seeking to serve God, are our practices according to the faith of God? Do we practice what we receive through His word? Or do we do things according to the teachings of men? Have you submitted to the Lord's will to become a child of His? We must look to God's word and examine the scriptures to be assured that we are walking by faith. Many err thinking they have eternal life but have failed to walk according to the faith that comes from God's word.

Don't Be Devoured

"Be of sober spirit, be on the alert. Your adversary, the devil, prowls about like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour" (1 Peter 5:8).

You are a targeted man or woman. You have a bullseye on your back. In the same way that assassins target important people, Satan has his eye on pillars in the church. He understands well the following truth: "Strike down the shepherd and the sheep of the flock will be scattered" (Matthew 26:31). Do not let the fact that your faith makes you a "marked man" inhibit your work and zeal. Simply use that danger to "keep yourself on your toes" spiritually. Always be ready to defend the faith, to fight off a temptation, or to throw water on any doubts taking a spark. The Bible confirms this idea, as we see that Satan repeatedly singles out and targets God's people:

"Simon, Simon, behold, Satan has demanded permission to sift you like wheat; but I have prayed for you, that your faith may not fail; and you, when once you have turned again, strengthen your brothers" (Luke 22:31-34).

"There was given me a thorn in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to buffet me" (2 Corinthians 12:7).

Much of the hardships we read about in the Bible have a very personal touch to them, as if Satan tailormakes situations that hit each person in a soft spot. Judas, Nehemiah, Job, Adam and Eve, King Saul – all of them faced the devil with varying degrees of success or failure. But all of them were attacked in personal ways.

This makes it all the more imperative that we each have examined our own lives and made certain that we are wearing our armor. "Put on the full armor of God, that you may be able to stand firm against the schemes of the devil" (Ephesians 6:11). Continuing, Paul explains that the armor of God is made up of real, practical habits and attitudes, not vague concepts. One who has his or her armor on:

Takes it as a whole, not in pieces;

Accepts and embraces absolute truth (6:14);

Wears righteousness with confidence, and never hides his moral objection to sin (6:14);

Knows that knowledge of the Gospel prepares us for spiritual combat (6:15)

Uses faith as a shield, not a crutch – there is a big difference between defending yourself with your faith and hiding behind it;

Leans heavily on prayer (6:18-19), fully assured that God hears our cries.
