Pleasing God By Faith

"But without faith it is impossible to please Him: for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those that diligently seek Him" (Hebrews 11:6).

We see here the necessity of faith if we are going to please God. The value of faith cannot be overestimated. If we are concerned about pleasing God, faith is a foundational element upon which we must please Him. Since faith is so crucial to our pleasing God, then we must ask, "Is everything man calls faith pleasing and acceptable to God?" The answer is simply, "no." In the world in which we live, it is not uncommon for peoples' concept of faith to be just the idea of mental assent. It is this kind of faith that James was speaking of when he said, "You believe that there is one God. You do well. Even the demons believe — and tremble! But do you want to know, O foolish man, that faith without works is dead?" (James 2:19-20). Indeed, all understand that the faith the demons had will not save, but what kind of faith will please God?

Two Elements About a Pleasing Faith

In Hebrews 11:6, we learn two things about the kind of biblical faith that pleases God:

- 1. "Must believe" is a belief (firm conviction... trust...assurance) that God exists.
- 2. "Diligently seek Him," the action of seeking after God.

These two elements of faith may be emphasized in different verses, but they never contradict one another. In order to have a faith that pleases God, it will not be just faith in His existence, but a faith that motivates us to actively seek His will.

The Example of Abraham's Faith

Paul, in Romans 4, speaks of one who had this kind of biblical, God-pleasing faith. His name was Abraham. God told Abraham that his descendants would become a great nation, that all nations of the earth would be blessed through his family, and he would receive a promised land. Abraham, by faith, left his homeland and lived as a pilgrim and

sojourner on this earth, looking for the promised land. Abraham's faith is described as being strong, not weak, and staggering. By his faith, he was justified because his faith was not in just the fact that there is a God, but he diligently sought to do the will of God. In Hebrews 11, the writer reminds us of the faith of Abraham, doing what God told him to do, even if it might have seemed by human reasoning to be wrong. His faith was strong; he sought to do what the Lord wanted to be done.

The Teaching of Jesus

As we have seen in these passages, Biblical faith involves both belief and action. Jesus taught this in the sermon on the mount, "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he who does the will of My Father in heaven. Many will say to Me in that day, 'Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name? And then will I declare to them, I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness" (Matthew 7:21-23). It is quite clear that those Jesus told to depart had a belief (mental assent) in God, but it was not the Biblical faith required to please God. Jesus described this kind of faith that pleases God as the faith that "does the Father's will" or "diligently seeks Him." James described the faith that pleases God and saves man as an active, living, working faith and not just mental assent or "faith only" (James 2:14-24).

Let us be zealous to have the kind of faith that saves, which is the faith that comes from God's word (Romans 10:17). A faith that is more than just a feeling or an impulse, but that which is done in accordance with a "thus saith the Lord." Having a faith that rests upon the word of God, we can be assured that we have a faith that pleases God. Anything short of that will cause disappointment and grief (Matthew 7:22-23; 25:41-46).

Undue Emphasis on Self

The Bible has a lot to say about self and how one is to view himself in relation to God and others. If a person would follow its teachings, his attitude toward self would be what it should be and many of his problems would be solved and pressures eased. When one follows the course of the world and gives undue emphasis to self, he not only adds to his problems now but also places his soul in peril.

What are those problems one can expect if he is self-centered?

Self-centeredness. This occurs when a person is absorbed in self. No one enjoys a self-centered person. It is easy to see when others are self-centered. Sometimes, though, it is hard to recognize in self.

Self-conceit. This is an exaggerated estimation of one's own ability or powers, an overconfidence in self. When one is conceited, he is full of pride. God hates pride and resists the proud (Proverbs16:18; James 4:6,10; Luke 18:14). We are not to think too highly of self (Romans 12:3).

Self-willed. One who is self-willed is stubborn, set on having his own way. One such person was Jonah. He knew the will of God but fled so he would not have to do it. The Jews who stoned Stephen were identified as "stiff-necked and uncircumcised in heart and ears" (Acts 7:51-53). That means that they stubbornly clung to their own will rather than submitting to the will of God.

Self-indulgence. This is giving free course to one's own passions and inclinations. Self-indulgence is a sin which leads one away from God. Demas, who had once been a faithful disciple and a dedicated co-worker of the apostle Paul, had forsaken the Lord and the apostle because he "loved" the present world and indulged himself in its pleasures (2 Timothy 4:10).

Self-righteousness. This is being righteous in one's own eyes. It was a trait of the Pharisees (Luke 18:9 -14; Romans 10:1-3). It prompted them to accuse Jesus of eating with sinners (Matthew 9:10-12). They could see that everyone else were sinners but they could not see their own sins. To be pleasing to God, one must humbly acknowledge his own sinfulness.

Self-satisfaction. This is being pleased with who and what one is. The world seeks to instill this attitude in everyone. Great care is often taken so that nothing will damage the self-image of children. The satisfied person has reached his goal. He has no other worlds to conquer, no loftier heights to scale and no greater work to do. His journey can only be downward.

On the other hand, one cannot establish bounds for the person who is not satisfied with himself and his accomplishments. Sadly, even Christians are guilty of this sin. Their guilt is seen in acceptance of mediocrity in relation to Christ and their service to Him. The church at Sardis was rebuked for their indifference (Revelation 3:1f). Do not be self-satisfied. Be like Paul—always seeking to be better, always striving to do more (Philippians 3:13-14; 1 Corinthians 10:12).

Do not allow these problems to exist in your life. Let the Word of God be your guide and permit it to mold you in the image of Christ by denying self and living for Him.
