How To Overcome Troubling Times

"The Lord also will be a refuge for the oppressed, A refuge in times of trouble." — (Psalm 9:9).

The words of a song we sing say, "Troublesome times are here, filling men's hearts with fear, freedoms we all hold dear now are at stake." As we live life today, we can see the times are troubling, indeed. The unrest over the invasion of Ukraine, following two years of a pandemic, sicknesses and health problems seem to abound. We are desperately looking for answers. The fact is that we may not ever find the answers in this life, but the Psalmist reminds us that God is a refuge for us in times of trouble. Knowing that God is our refuge, let us consider how to overcome troublesome times.

Keep Close to God.

In difficult times people will often run away from God, or they may even blame God for the trouble they are dealing with. First, God does not cause problems for us in this life. God made the earth and blessed man with the perfect place in the garden of Eden. Man chose to sin and left the place of perfection God made for man. Living in a world of sin and the choices that men make, we suffer many problems and difficulties in life. It is not God who brings the problems and troubles of life about, but man's bad choices. We must remember that God wants us to live with Him in heaven, a place of perfection, from all the problems and struggles in life. Remember, it was God who "gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life (John 3:16). The love of God for us is evident on the cross upon which Jesus died. In troublesome times we desperately need to keep ourselves close to God.

Keep Close to God's People.

People need people. In Genesis 2:18, God said, "It is not good that man should be alone." From the very beginning, God has made it clear that man is a social being. Throughout the scriptures, we see this emphasized repeatedly with the children of Israel in the Old Testament and then with

the Christians in the New Testament. In Acts 2, after the 3,000 were baptized, we are told: "Now all who believed were together, and had all things in common, and sold their possessions and goods, and divided them among all, as anyone had need...Daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they ate their food with gladness and simplicity of heart" (Acts 2:44-45). We see they were together and knew about the needs of one another. When the people of God draw together in this way, they will be able to effectively help bear one another's burdens (Galatians 6:2). Paul told the Thessalonians to "comfort each other and edify one another" (1 Thessalonians 5:11). The Hebrew writer writes, "consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together" (Hebrews 10:24-25a). Many other passages we could note make the same or similar statements. These verses will be sufficient for us to know that in troublesome times, we need one another:

- To help bear with our troubles.
- · To comfort us.
- To edify or build us up.
- To stir us to be active in love and doing good.
- How do we do this? By being together.

Keep Closely Focused On God's Word.

The scriptures are filled with promises from God. Many of these promises have to do with God and His providential care for us. Let us notice just a few:

Matthew 28:19-20—"Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you, and lo I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

Matthew 11:28-30— "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For My yoke is easy and My burden is light."

John 14:27—"Peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

Isaiah 41:10 — "Fear not, for I am with you; Be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you, Yes, I will help you, I will uphold you with My righteous right hand."

Romans 8:35-39 — "Who shall separate us from the

love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written: "For Your sake we are killed all day long; We are accounted as sheep for the slaughter. Yet in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

In troublesome times, let us keep ourselves close to God, to the people of God, and focus on God's word and the promises that God has given us. For it is God who has made us and knows our every need, and His desire is for us to live with Him forever.

Yet, he was elected President of the United States in 1860 and became one of the great men of all history. Though it seems he failed often, he never really failed because of the simple fact that he never gave up.

Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ, wrote that we should "not lose heart in doing good, for in due time we shall reap if we do not grow weary" (Galatians 6:9). And Jesus

tells us that "at all times (we) ought to pray and not to lose heart" (Luke 18:1)
