Preaching Jesus!

"Then Philip went down to the city of Samaria and preached Christ to them... Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning at this Scripture, preached Jesus to him"— (Acts 8:5, 35).

In Acts 8, we see Philip after the Christians were scattered and preached the word. Luke records in verse 5 that Philip "preached Christ." Many people in the religious world today say, "We need just to preach Jesus and forget about the church and the plan of salvation." They think preaching Jesus should be "about the man and the plan." As we look at the Samaritans and the man from Ethiopia, notice how preaching Christ involved the man and the plan.

The Preaching To The Samaritans

In verse 5, we find Philip going to the city of Samaria. Philip went there to preach Christ. As Philip preached, he confirmed his teaching by performing miracles. "When they believed Philip as he preached the things concerning the kingdom of God, and the name of Jesus Christ, both men and women were baptized" (Acts 8:12). Even a man that had used sorcery and bewitched the people of Samaria believed and was baptized (Acts 8:13). Philip preached Christ or Jesus involved the teaching of what man must do to be born again; saved. The reason for this is the Samaritans were baptized after the preaching of Christ. Why? I suppose that teaching them about Jesus involved the things He did and taught. Philip taught about Jesus and His baptism to fulfill all righteousness and the great commission He gave before His ascension to heaven (Matthew 3:13-15; Mark 16:15-16).

The Ethiopian Eunuch

After the conversion of many in Samaria, Philip came into contact with a man, the Ethiopian treasurer, on the road to Gaza. This man had been to Jerusalem to worship God. He had traveled many miles and was reading from the prophet Isaiah while returning home. The prophecy he was reading was about Christ, but he did not understand who Isaiah was

speaking of, and he asked Philip to see if he could give him an answer. "Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning at this Scripture, preached Jesus to him" (Acts 8:35). After Philip preached Jesus, as they rode along, they came to some water, and the Ethiopian said, "See, here is water. What hinders me from being baptized?" We see Philip preaching Jesus resulted in the Ethiopian learning of his need to obey the commands of the Lord. He obeyed by being baptized just as the Samaritans had done earlier.

To preach Jesus today will do the same thing it did in the first century as the Samaritans heard the preaching of Jesus and the man from Ethiopia. The preaching of Jesus is what will save the souls of men. Let us resolve to preach Jesus!

- Romans 1:8 "First, I thank my God through
 Jesus Christ for you all because your faith is being
 proclaimed throughout the whole world."
- Ephesians 1:15-16 "For this reason I too, having heard of the faith in the Lord Jesus which exists among you and your love for all the saints, do not cease giving thanks for you while making mention of you in my prayers..."
- Colossians 1:12-14 "...giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified us to share in the inheritance of the saints in Light. For He rescued us from the domain of darkness, and transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins."

These are just a sampling of a few verses that call us to give thanks for God's forgiveness, God's goodness, for each other, and, perhaps most important, for the salvation that God offers to us. So the question for us is are we thankful for these things?
