## "Do Not Marvel..."

"Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not marvel that I said `to you 'You must be born again." – (John 3:5-7)

We find Nicodemus and Jesus having a conversation one evening. Jesus takes this opportunity to declare to Nicodemus the subject of the new birth and the necessity of it to "enter the kingdom of God." As a Jew and a Pharisee, Nicodemus marveled at the statement Jesus made. Jesus responded to Nicodemus by telling him, "Do not marvel...." The new birth is a marvel to all who are not spiritual. We must not marvel at Jesus' instructions, "You must be born again." Let us consider reasons not to marvel.

## Marvel - As If It Is Unreasonable

The wisdom of the world cries that the new birth is unreasonable. But God has made simple essential facts about the new birth.

- 1. The kingdom's seed is God's word (Luke 8:11; James 1:18; 1 Peter 1:23.)
- 2. The seed is sown in soil which is the heart of man (Luke 8:12).
- 3. When the seed is sown and buried in good soil, birth is the result.

As we understand the germination process, we know that if a seed is to be born and produce a plant, it must have the seed in contact with soil. The new birth is not unreasonable; it is a matter of faith.

## Marvel - As If It Is Impossible

Some believe that reality only exists if it is explainable in the physical realm. Nicodemus fell into this line of thinking when he asked, "How can these things be?" (John 3:9). We must remember that we are dealing with God, who makes all things possible.

1. God gives life (Genesis 2:7; Luke 1:27-38). In the Garden of Eden, the seed is given for Mary to have a Son. So as God can place the seed to produce physical life, the seed, the word of God, can produce

- spiritual life.
- 2. There is evidence of birth. We see the evidence of physical life all around us. Plants sprout and grow, babies are born and grow, and we see this evidence everywhere. Just as we see the evidence in the physical realm, there is evidence in spiritual birth and life. A change of life –affections, will, and conduct is proof of the new birth.

## Marvel - As If It Is Unnecessary.

Some will argue that the new birth is unnecessary, but if that were true, then it would declare that the old man and the sins of the past will not condemn him. We must remember Paul told the Romans the old man was crucified when they were baptized and arose to walk in the new life (Romans 6:4-6). Everyone is a sinner (Romans 3:23), and we must remove those sins to be made new. The process of spiritual birth occurs when the seed, the word of God, convicts us of our sins and causes us to repent and be buried in baptism. In Acts 2, three thousand Jews on that day were convicted by the preaching of Peter, and they repented and were baptized as Peter commanded them (Acts 2:38). If those Jews on that day had marveled and argued it was unnecessary to do anything to be born again, then they would have remained in their sins and would never receive the benefits of the kingdom of God.

May we remember not to look and marvel at the teachings of the Lord. Let us always be ready to heed the instructions of God and encourage others to do the same.

As David sings and gives thanks to the LORD with his "whole heart," notice what he says in the rest of verse 2:

... for you have exalted above all things your name and your word.

To exalt is to raise in rank, power, or character. When we "exalt" someone, we are elevating them and acknowledging their worth.

Listen to Psalm 138. Your Creator has exalted his name and his word "above all things." Think about that. Nothing—not one thing in the universe—is higher in rank, power, or worth than the name and the word of God. His name is more important than my name and your name. His word matters more than anyone else's word.

Life, the way it was meant to be, recognizes these realities and follows the Creator's lead. In fact, that's the opportunity before each one of us on this, the Lord's day—to say, "I give thanks to you with my whole heart. I sing your praise. I honor you for your steadfast love and faithfulness. I exalt your name and your word above all things."

Let's worship with that heart-fuel today. Let's live and view the world through that lens this week. Could your prayers use a breath of fresh God-provided air? You'd be hard-pressed to find something better than adopting Psalm 138:2 and praying it as your own: "Father, help me to exalt your name and your word above all things."

That's the key to living with the confidence David expressed in Psalm 138:8: "The LORD will fulfill his purpose for me."

## The Christ and His Church

Based upon the confession that Peter made that Jesus was the Christ, Jesus promised to build His church (Matthew 16:18). This is the first time that the church is mentioned in the New Testament. The church that Jesus refers to was His. He calls it "my church." The church was a prized possession of Christ and would that He would purchase and build at a high cost. He purchased the church "with His own blood" (Acts 20:28).

Just imagine your favorite childhood toy, whether it was a shiny toy truck, or your favorite teddy bear. Think about how much you cherished that toy. You would show it off, take care of it, you wanted others to see it and know that it belonged to you. On a very basic level, this is how the New Testament speaks of Christ and His relationship to the church.

The husband-wife relationship is used to describe the relationship that Christ has with the church. Christ being the husband and the church being His bride (Ephesians 5:23-25). Christ has distinguished His church through cleansing her (Ephesians 5:26). The church is to be holy and perfect (Ephesians 5:27). Christ takes great care of His bride, "for no man ever yet hated his own flesh; but nourisheth and cherisheth it, even as the Lord the church," (Ephesians 5:29). Do you begin to recognize just how important the church is to Jesus? He was willing to give His life and His blood for His bride. That is the true meaning of love!

There was only one church that Christ promised to build. He did not promise to build "churches," but promised to build "my church." His promise was to build the church that would be under His leadership and guidance. His promise was to build the church of His possession, or the church of Christ.

Christ is the head of only one body (Ephesians 4:4; 5:23). The church is not merely a cold, religious institution that seeks to control its members. The church of Christ is the ultimate expression of love, grace, and truth. We need to make certain that we are members of the church of Christ.
