What Is Baptism?

How much do you know about baptism? Are you confused over the various teachings and practices in regard to baptism? Consider from the Bible what baptism is and what it is for.

Baptism is the act of being immersed in water. Some religious groups sprinkle water on a person and call it baptism, but Bible baptism is immersing or plunging into water. Romans 6:4 calls baptism a "burial" and parallels it to the burial and resurrection of Christ in the tomb. This is also seen in the case in Acts 8 when the treasurer from Ethiopia was baptized. "Both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water, and he baptized him. Now when they came up out of the water..." (Acts 8:38-39). They didn't kneel down beside the water for a sprinkling. It was necessary that they both get into the water so an immersion could take place. Any reliable Bible reference work will state that immersion was the original meaning of the word "baptize."

Baptism is a command that is connected to the preaching of the gospel. Anyone who desires to become a Christian and be saved through Christ must be baptized. Jesus commanded the teaching and practice of baptism with the preaching of the gospel (Matthew 28:18-20 and Mark 16:15-16). In Acts 2 when the message that Jesus was the Christ was preached, the audience cried out and asked what to do. In vs. 38 we are told that Peter responded by saying, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." Peter taught what Christ commanded. When a person desires to obey the call of the gospel and have his sins forgiven, he responds by being baptized. This baptism is to take place when one believes that Jesus is the Christ (Mark 16:16 and Acts 2:36-38). This belief is to be confessed before others (Romans 10:8-10). In addition an attitude of repentance is to accompany the act (Acts 2:38 and Luke 24:46-47).

Another passage that shows the connection between baptism and salvation is 1 Peter 3. In verse 20 the apostle Peter is writing about Noah and his family being saved in the flood that destroyed the wicked of their day. The divinely inspired writer then makes a parallel in the next verse. "There is also an antitype which now saves us, namely baptism (not the removal of the filth of the flesh, but the answer of a good conscience toward God), through the resurrection of Jesus Christ" (1 Peter 3:21). This passage states plainly that baptism is necessary for salvation. It has nothing to do with powers in the waters, but it has to do with an honest and sincere person responding out of a good conscience and obeyng what God has commanded. Any person who is truly seeking to be right with God, who is willing to submit their will to the Lord's, will obey without hesitation what God has told them to do. God has commanded baptism as the avenue through which a person contacts salvation and finds forgiveness of sins in Christ. These passages that have been listed state this plainly and simply.

Study your Bible for yourself and see what God has said about baptism. Examine for yourself the role of baptism in salvation.

How To Change Your Life

How does one make significant spiritual changes? How do you improve your service to God? How do you break the old patterns and undergo a complete paradigm shift to make fundamental changes in your life? These five key points will help, if you take them to heart.

Listen to life-changing truth with passion. I'm in favor of doing things "decently and in order," but if you park your brain in the vestibule, sit down on a pew and vegetate, you won't get very much out of a sermon. Take your physical and mental intensity to the next level!

Raise your personal expectation. "Excel still more" (1 Thessalonians 4:1, 9-10; Philippians 3:12-14). A famous success coach says, "We must remember that the same level of thinking that brought us where we are

today will not take us to where want to go tomorrow." The Bible puts it this way: "Whatever your hand finds to do, verily do it with all your might; for there is no activity or planning or wisdom in Sheol where you are going" (Ecclesiates 9:10). I do not agree with all the personal philosophies of Nelson Mandela, but he is right when he says, "There is no passion to be found in playing small – in settling for a life that is less than what you are capable of living."

Harness the power of faith in God. "I can do all things through Him who strengthens me" (Philippians 4:13). You have this built-in, God-given capacity to be all that you can be - to dream big dreams, to make a profound difference for good. Do you believe it? Part of the secret is replacing your limiting beliefs with empowering beliefs. You're not just a "victim" of circumstances beyond your control. An example of a limiting belief is found in the lame man at the pool of Bethesda (John 5:5-7). He was preoccupied with finding someone to put him in the pool when the water was stirred, while the real answer to his problem was standing right in front of him, in the Person of Jesus! We have all been conditioned to think a certain way, but in reality, we have the power to accomplish a whole lot of good things if we believe, with God's help, that we can put these virtues into action (Luke 17:6).

Model successful godly behavior. Success leaves footprints. Someone has said, "Do what other successful people do, and you will be successful." This is as true of spiritual success as it is in any realm. "Fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12:2). Follow the example of your Savior!

Other Christians can help as well. Do you want to do something well in the Lord's work? Then learn as much as you can from someone who's doing it well. Find a mentor, ask for advice, and then follow his or her godly example.

Decide to succeed at all costs. Successful people are not lucky. "Luck is a matter of preparation meeting opportunity." You're going to make some mistakes along the way. A successful businessman turned an indecisive, insecure secretary into the finest secretary he's ever had. He told her "Make some mistakes. Do the best you can, but let it rip and just start making decisions. There isn't

anything you can foul up that we can't fix." That little piece of advice changed her life!

Too many Christians suffer from paralysis of analysis. In your effort to honorably do the Lord's work, you're going to make some mistakes. It is better to go forward and learn from these mistakes, than to remain inactive. Be clear on the goals you would like to accomplish, and prayfully commit yourself to them. Indeed, "the harvest is plentiful but the laborers are few; therefore beseech the Lord of harvest to send out laborers into His harvest (Luke 10:2).
