The Authority of Christ

Where do we get authority for the things we practice in religion? If this question were asked of several different people, there would most likely be a varied response. Some would place their authority in men, or creeds, or mere human reasoning. However, all need to realize that those who will hear "well done, thou good and faithful servant" at the day of judgement, will be those who have done the will of the Father (Matthew 7:21). The Father sent His Son (Christ) to earth to fulfill His plan in saving man (1 John 4:14). Christ, after fulfilling the Father's plan before He ascended back to heaven said, "All power is given to me in heaven and in earth" (Matthew 28:18). However, little attention is given to the authority of Christ in the day in which we live. Let us look at what the Scriptures teach about the authority Christ has.

The authority of Christ can be clearly seen throughout the New Testament. Hebrews 1:1-2 states this clearly as we read, "God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son." Also, Christ said in John 12:48, "He that rejecteth me, and receiveth not my words, hath one that judgeth him: the word that I have spoken, the same shall judge him in the last day." In Hebrews 5:9 the writer tells us that Christ is "the author of eternal salvation unto all that obey him." Notice Christ said we are to be judged by the things that he taught concerning righteousness and our salvation is conditioned upon our obedience to Christ. Remember, Christ has all authority today (Matthew 28:18; Ephesians 1:20-22) and will continue to have this authority until the resurrection; the end of time (1 Corinthians 15:24). No one shares this authority with Christ, not even Moses or any prophet or any man. Therefore, the only appeal we can make for our faith and practice is to the law of Christ, not the law of Moses, the teachings of the prophets, or the creeds of men. To look to any other source for our authority is to turn from the one true authority and would classify us with the workers of iniquity that Christ mentioned in Matthew 7:21-23. Indeed, no one wants to stand at the day of judgment and hear Christ say, "Depart from me, ye that work iniquity." Certainly, those that

stray from the authority of Christ (our lawgiver) are without the law (workers of iniquity). That being the case, it should behoove each one of us to examine ourselves and insure that we are walking "by faith and not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7) and accepting "what the Lord hath spoken!"

It is important that we understand that Christ delegated authority to the apostles. Therefore, the teaching and writing they did throughout the New Testament was a carrying out of Christ authority. We can see this further in John 13:20 where Christ says, "Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that receiveth whomsoever I send receiveth him that sent me." Christ inspired the apostles by sending the Holy Spirit to bring to remembrance all things Christ had taught and to guide them into to all truth (John 14:26; 16:13). Notice what Paul said to the Corinthians about his relation as an apostle of Christ, "Now then we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God did beseech you by us: we pray you in Christ's stead, be ye reconciled to God" (2 Corinthians 5:20). Paul said the apostles (we) were ambassadors (a representative sent in behalf of another having authority), and prayed in Christ's stead. Certainly, no one can doubt the apostles spoke with authority they received from Christ. We see that Christ spoke of the authority that the apostles had as he said "whatsoever thou shalt bind on earth shall be bound in heaven: and whatsoever thou shalt loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven" (Matthew 16:19b). Indeed, the apostles spoke and wrote the things they were inspired to say and write by the Holy Spirit (2 Peter 1:16-21; 1 Corinthians 2:11-13).

The authority of Christ was confirmed by the miracles that he worked while upon earth. In John 20:30-31 we read, "And many other signs truly did Jesus in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book: But these are written, that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ the Son of God: and that believing ye might have life through his name." Speaking of Christ, on the day of Pentecost, Peter said, "a man approved of God among you by miracles and wonders and signs, which God did by him in the midst of you, as ye yourselves also know" (Acts 2:22). Therefore, by these miracles Christ confirmed who He was, the Son of God, and established the fact that his authority came from God (John 3:1-2).

Therefore, let us humble and submit ourselves to the authority of Christ in all he has commanded us to do. And may we all abide in the things that we are in taught in God's Word, remembering that it is by the law of Christ that we will be judged.

Our goal should be to examine our life with the same objectivity that God uses in evaluating our character. Since He knows about us (Hebrews 4:13), and since His "gauge" is the only accurate one, we should relish any proper correction in our life that is necessary. If the exam reveals a flaw in my character, and if I want to avoid spiritual death, I will gladly accept the correction. If I want to die, I can simply ignore the warnings or refuse to take the examination. It's that simple..
