What Is A True Disciple of Jesus?

Jesus came to give us "life more abundant" (John 10:10), which is the greatest quality of life known to man. As our Creator (John 1:3), He knows how we work best. He alone offers abundant spiritual blessings of forgiveness of sins, peace with God, joy, grace, love, hope and power for living (Ephesians 1:3-14), which is accepted by obedient faith (Acts 2:38, 3:19).

Yet, what does the Lord require of us to be a true follower? "He who loves father or mother more than Me is not worthy of Me; and he who loves son or daughter more than Me is not worthy of Me. And he who does not take his cross and follow after Me is not worthy of Me. He who has found his life will lose it, and he who has lost his life for My sake will find it" (Matthew 10:37-39). We must be devoted disciples by abandoning all to follow Him. "So therefore, any one of you who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple" (Luke 14:33).

So the Lord Jesus Christ clearly challenges us with divine requirements in following Him as a real, committed disciple. Otherwise, He says, we "are not worthy of Him." In the United States, which is one of the most "religious" countries in the world, one major survey shows 74% of Americans say they believe in Jesus as God's Son who came to earth to die for our sins (Rasmussen Survey, April 2011). Yet, one major survey found that there is no major difference in the moral behavior of most regular church goers versus non-church goers ("Faith Has Limited Effect On Most People's Behavior," Barna Research Group,2004). Most so-called believers are merely "fans" of Jesus, not followers.

Something is radically missing! It's real discipleship in obeying Jesus. Will the real disciple of Jesus please take a stand to follow Him to heaven? Please note what the Lord said comprises being His true "disciple."

1. Becoming More Like Christ in Every Way. Jesus said, "A disciple is not above his teacher, but everyone when he is fully trained will be like his teacher" (Luke 6:40). He offers us His yoke of discipleship. "Come to

me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light" (Matthew 11:28-30). A disciple not only knows what His teacher knows, he becomes as His Teacher is!

- 2. Abiding in Christ's Word. "Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, 'If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free" (John 8:32-32). The "word of Christ" (Colossians 3:16) encompass the 27 books of the New Testament.
- **3. Bearing Fruit for God.** "By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples" (John 15:8). Anyone can give lip-service to being Jesus' disciple, but the proof is in the spiritual fruit of our lives by abiding in Christ and lovingly obeying His Word (John 15:1-11)!

4. Brotherly Love for One Another Like Jesus.

"A new commandment I give you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:34-35). A clear mark of the one, true church of Christ is sacrificial love for one another, learned from the sacrificial love of Jesus.

5. Dying to Self Each Day to Live for Him.

"Then Jesus told his disciples, 'If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me" (Matthew 16:24). The cross, as in Jesus' self denial in sacrificing Himself for us, was an instrument of death. For His disciple, it is death to self-will, in order to have new life and new, God-centered perspective in following Jesus. "For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it" (Matthew 16:25).

The price of discipleship is high, for Jesus requires our "all." Yet, in God's grace, the price is low, because "anyone" can choose to surrender self to God and follow Jesus to heaven. Are you a true disciple of Jesus?

The Good and Right Way

"Far be it from me that I should sin against the Lord in ceasing to pray for you; but I will teach you the good and the right way" (1 Samuel 12:23). To understand the setting, note that these words were spoken by Samuel at what might be called Saul's coronation. In 1 Samuel 8 the Israelites had informed Samuel that he was old, his children were unworthy, and they wanted a king like nations around them. It is obvious Samuel felt a certain hurt by Israel's rejection of him (though God assured him that it was really His reign they were rejecting – 1 Samuel 8:7), yet Samuel refused to become embittered. This noble judge and prophet intended to keep on teaching and praying for the people.

What a lesson for us today when we feel that our friends, family or brethren have in some way wronged us. If we feel mistreated do we get angry, pout, stay home, etc., or do we get on our knees and pray for those who have not shown us the respect we feel we deserve? Do we continue to preach and teach the good and right way, or do we find ourselves quietly hoping something will happen so they will "learn their lesson" and appreciate us the way they should? I know that in my own experiences I have not always been like Samuel, but this is the model we should strive to imitate.

At a recent service there were a number of those who came in the building as the classes began, a teacher among them. This has got to have an effect on our overall enthusiasm. An elder once announced the time of a meeting: "The service starts at 7:30. That's not the time of arrival, arrival time is no later than 7:15. Be here and in your place before 7:30" We all can do better.
