"Eternal Salvation to All Who Obey Him"

"Though He was a Son, yet He learned obedience by the things which He suffered. And having been perfected, He became the author of eternal salvation to all who obey Him" — (Hebrews 5:8-9).

The Hebrew writer speaks of Christ learning obedience, then says that Christ is the author of eternal salvation to all who obey Him. Jesus taught the importance of obedience as He said, "Not everyone who says to Me, Lord, Lord, shall enter the kingdom of heaven; but he who does the will of My Father in heaven" (Matthew 7:21). Jesus emphasized that the determination of a man's salvation is dependent on doing the will of God or obeying God.

However, many believe and teach that obedience is not necessary for salvation. Many believe man is saved "wholly of grace" by faith in Christ. They will profess that man does not need to do anything to be saved from his sins. But what do the Scriptures say? Jesus and the Hebrew writer both stress that obedience accompanies salvation. In other words, without man's obedience, there is no salvation but eternal destruction (2 Thessalonians 1:7-9). In James 2:14-26, James, talking about faith and works (works of obedience), says that "faith without works is dead." If a man's faith does not lead him to do the things God requires it will not produce life. Obedience to the commands of God is what causes us to be born again (John 3:3-5).

We must understand that obedience is not merely doing certain things but involves doing the things God has commanded, being prompted to submit to the will of God. Obedience must be based upon faith in God through Christ (Hebrews 11:6; Matthew 28:18). Noah, by faith, built an ark to save his house (Hebrews 11:7). By faith, Abraham pleased God as he obeyed the commands of God, even attempting to offer his only son upon the altar according to the command of God (Hebrews 11:17-19).

When Peter told those at Jerusalem to "Repent and be baptized" in Acts 2:38, he spoke the will of God to men. He told those gathered there that they needed to obey the command of God (Luke 13:3; Mark

16:16). On the day of Pentecost, these religious people had perhaps traveled great distances to be at Jerusalem for the observance. Still, they lacked obedience to the commands of God to be saved. They were similar to those in Matthew 7, that claimed to be workers of many wonderful works but were lacking in doing the will of the Father.

We must understand that to be saved, we must obey the commands of God to receive forgiveness. To do the will of God, we must do what the Lord has told us in His word; then, we will be saved by faith, but we will not be saved short of our obedience to God and His will. Noah, Abraham, and all the great men of faith were saved because they obeyed the commands of God. Have you done what the word of God teaches us to do? If not, obey him today, for those that "obey not the gospel... shall be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord" (2 Thessalonians 1:7-9).

Two Rich Churches

Things were not going well for the church in Smyrna -- from a worldly perspective, that is. In the letter addressed to them in Revelation 2, mention is made of their tribulation and how they had suffered at the hands of some Jews. Things weren't to get any better soon, either. Some of them were about to be thrown into prison because of their faith -- perhaps, even executed. They were an impoverished people, financially speaking. (It doesn't appear that they had heard of the 'health and wealth gospel'we hear preached so often today, does it?)

Yet the Lord looked at His people in Smyrna and said, "But you are rich" (2:8ff). Hmmm....

About 100 miles away the church at Laodicea was doing great -- or so they thought. They were rich and had everything they needed -- so they said. Yet the Lord looked at them and told them they were "wretched, miserable, poor..." (3:14ff).

"How can this be?" someone asks.

Obviously the Lord doesn't look at riches the way we do. We can have all this world's goods we desire, live in luxury -- even meet with 'saints' in a beautiful building -- yet if we are "lukewarm" in the Lord's service (as was Laodicea), we are spiritually poor and without Jesus' approval.

On the other hand, we can be "rich," even while living in squalor or rotting in a dungeon. If we have the Lord's approval and, consequently, look forward to a "crown of life," we are rich indeed!

In our materialistic culture, we need to continually reevaluate our thinking about riches. Material wealth is fine, though it comes with many weighty responsibilities (1 Timothy 6:17-19). What truly matters is whether or not we are spiritually rich.

"Be merciful to me." Forgiveness! Ah, what assurance it gives! The man who knows that God has forgiven him need not fear death. He need not reason from consequences. He need not despair over life's inequities. He is forgiven. That's his confidence. What else does he require?

"I thought about my ways, and turned my feet." Men act with certainty. They exude confidence in their business decisions. They justify immoral behavior. But it's all a facade. The child of God thinks about his ways in the light of God's way, and gets on the right track. That's his confidence.

"I made haste, and did not delay to keep your commandments." Deadlines. Due dates. Appointments. So what if you keep them all, but never make an appointment with God? What have you accomplished? The believer doesn't put off spiritual priorities. He doesn't delay obedience. His priorities are in order. That's his confidence.
