Jesus' Visit to Bethany

"And when she had said these things, she went her way secretly called Mary her sister, saying, 'The Teacher has come and is calling for you"" — (John 11:28).

In John 11, Lazarus is stricken with sickness that takes his life. Jesus was in Decapolis, beyond the Jordan, and received word from Lazarus' sisters that he was sick and nearing death. Mary and Martha's devotion and faith in Jesus wanted Him to be with them. Jesus delays His journey to Bethany, and when He arrives, Lazarus has already passed away. When Martha hears that Jesus has come, she immediately goes out to meet Jesus. After meeting and conversing with Jesus, Martha went and told Mary that Jesus had arrived and wanted to see her. Let us consider some things we can learn from this.

The Teacher Has Come.

In times of great distress and trouble, Jesus had arrived to be with His dear friends, Mary and Martha. It was the time of the passing of their brother, Lazarus. The sorrow that had come to Mary and Martha is typical of the distress and trouble mankind deals with (Job. 14:1). We can learn from this that Jesus will be with us in our times of trouble. Jesus is always with us and will not forsake us (Hebrews 13:5-6). Jesus came in the flesh and dwelt among man and understands the sorrows and trouble of life. He can sympathize with us in our afflictions (Hebrews 4:15). As our example, Jesus shows us how we should go to sympathize with and comfort others in times of distress and trouble. Let us follow Jesus by coming to others in their times of need.

He is Calling for You.

We all have experienced times when someone we know has been talking to another person we know, and they ask about us and send word to tell us "hello." Indeed, Mary must have had this incredible feeling knowing that Jesus was calling for her. This is a personal call for Mary. Why? Because Jesus, as Mary's dear friend, wanted to be a source of comfort and strength in her time of trouble. When Mary arrived where Jesus was, He asked, "Where have you laid him?" (John 11:34). Jesus did not beat around the bush but went directly to the source of the sorrow Mary and Martha were facing. They went immediately to the grave, and we are told, "Jesus wept" (John 11:35). Jesus came face to face with sorrow. Jesus calls for Mary so that He can sympathize with her and Martha. He comforts them by:

- Giving reassurance of the truth of God's word.
- A great demonstration by bringing Lazarus back.

We learn much about the care and concern Jesus has for His friends and His people. But as the day ends and they leave the empty tomb of Lazarus, let us not overlook the renewed assurance of the hope that is in Christ. The hope of the great resurrection of us all in the last great day. To go to the home that Jesus has prepared for us where there is no sorrow, no pain, no tears, and no death.

Because He Was Faithful

As one reads through the book of Daniel, there are many great stories to revisit. One that stands out is when Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-Nego were cast into the fiery furnace for not bowing to the golden image (Daniel 3). Another is when Daniel was thrown into the lion's den for breaking a law by praying to God (Daniel 6).

Do you remember how Daniel's enemies were able to get him in trouble with the king? In Daniel 6:4, the governors and satraps concluded that "they could find no charge or fault, because he was faithful; nor was there any error of fault found in him." You might expect these evil men to struggle to get Daniel to do anything wrong. You would be right...in the eyes of the Lord.

The interesting thing is what these wicked individuals decided to do. "Then these men said, 'We shall not find any charge against this Daniel unless we find it against him concerning the law of his God." (verse 5). They realized that if they are going to discredit Daniel in the eyes of king Darius (who liked Daniel), they would have to use Daniel's loyalty to his God against him. They convinced the king to make a decree that for thirty days no one could petition any god or man except the king (verses 7-9). Thus, when Daniel prayed to God as he always did, his enemies now had something of which to accuse him to the king (verses 12-13). They had successfully used Daniel's faith against him.

This is a valuable lesson we need to learn as Christians today. When God's people are faithful, Satan will do all he can to get us to grow weary in doing good (Galatians 6:9). If members of the church will not engage in the immoral acts the world offers, then the devil will use our dedication to the Lord to create division within the body of Christ. This is exactly what the faithful church at Philadelphia was warned about (Revelation 3:7-13).

The devil can use the faithfulness of Christians against them by having our good actions condemned as evil ones (1 Peter 3:15; 4:14). For example, the world criticizes Christians who are rightly opposed to homosexual acts (Romans 1:26-28). Similarly, local churches can be criticized for rightly disciplining a person who brings reproach upon the church. Some people will resist scripturally-required church discipline, and wellintentioned, faithful Christians can stumble in the face of this criticism even though it is something God calls for.

This should not surprise us. Why? Just like the enemies of Daniel, a local church full of godly members who are united in serving the Lord can still be divided by Satan if he uses their faithfulness against them. If the church strives to please the Lord by trying to keep itself unspotted, Satan can try to use this as a tool (1 Peter 5:8). However, the faithful will endure because they stay focused on two Godly goals; keeping the church unspotted (Ephesians 5:27) and doing everything we can to help others be faithful to God (James 5:19-20).

To illustrate these points, I was told a wonderful story recently. A congregation and its preacher were trying to help return his wayward daughter to the Lord. She had been living in an ungodly way, and they wanted her to repent. Eventually, the preacher had to tearfully read the letter of withdrawal. His daughter stood up while he was reading and started to come forward. The preacher (her dad) ran down and embraced her. There was not a dry eye in the building. I was told this while attending a funeral. Both the preacher and his daughter were in attendance at the funeral. May we trust in the Lord and in His ways even when those around us offer criticism. ~via *Southside Sower*; Springfield, Missouri.
