A Royal Adventure

"For whatever things were written before were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the Scriptures might have hope"— (Romans 15:4).

As Paul writes to the church in Rome, he reminds them there is value in the Scriptures written during the Law of Moses. Paul said that the things were written for our learning and ultimately to give us hope. This week during our Vacation Bible School, the studies will look at the kings of the Bible. From the kings of the Bible, we will learn some valuable lessons and help us to truly see that Jesus is "Lord of lords and King of kings" (Revelation 17:14).

King Solomon.

First, we will examine King Solomon, who built the Temple of God. We will see Solomon as he prayed for wisdom; the Lord rewarded him with honor, riches, and then to build the house for God (1 Chronicles 1:8-12). This will give us time to consider the requests we make to God and our reasons for the requests. King Solomon pleased God, and there are lessons for us to learn from 1 Kings 6-9.

King Hezekiah.

On Tuesday, we will be looking at King Hezekiah. The text will be from 2 Kings 18-19, and we will focus on Hezekiah's loyalty to God. We will see Hezekiah's great faith in God as he prayed to God, asking for His help in defeating the Assyrian army that he had to do battle with. The lesson here will demonstrate how our humility and faith are vital as we serve the Lord and commit to Him.

King Nabuchadnezzar.

Wednesday, we will look in Daniel 4, and we will see King Nebuchadnezzar, a man of great arrogance and very full of himself, but God humbled him, and it changed his attitude and direction of life. There will be many great lessons for us to learn from Nebuchadnezzar.

Jesus Christ is King of kings.

We will conclude on Thursday by looking at Jesus Christ. He is indeed the "Lord of lords and King of kings" (Revelation 17:14). We will see that Jesus was the only perfect King who has ever lived. We will see the price He paid for His people. We will gain the great motivation to serve Him all the days of our lives so that we may be pleasing to Him.

The Royal Adventure we will experience this week will make us all better people. People that are better equipped to help others to be better people. Come join us.
