Seeing Heaven As Our Goal

"For we know that if our earthly house, this tent, is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens" — (1 Corinthians 5:1).

Paul reminds the Corinthians to live their lives to keep heaven in view. The first-century disciples were a fascinating group of people. In Acts, we find the early Christians suffering terrible persecution because they were disciples of Christ and believed in the resurrection of Christ. The life of Paul is well known for the things he suffered after he became a Christian. The question is often asked, "Why did Paul and the early disciples go through all of this suffering?" and "How was he able to be faithful?" The answer is: It was with the view of life he lived. Paul lived with a view of heaven. His goal in life was to be in heaven eternally, and we ought to live with this goal before us. How can we do this?

We Must Recognize That This World Is Not Our Home.

We must understand that all the things of this life that are such a joy to us here are not ours for eternity. One day we will leave this life and all the things of this life behind. The attitude that Abraham lived with as a stranger in a strange land. The Hebrew writer says Abraham "sojourned in the land of promise, as in a foreign country, dwelling in tents with Isaac and Jacob...waited for a city which has foundations, whose builder and maker is God" (Hebrews 11:9-10). Paul shows the same attitude as he writes, "For to me, to live is Christ, and to die is gain. But if I live on in the flesh, this will mean fruit from my labor; yet what I shall choose I cannot tell. For I am hard pressed between the two, having a desire to depart and be with Christ, which is far better" (Philippians 1:21-23). Paul's focus in life was like that of Abraham, looking to God and Jesus Christ. God has blessed us in many ways, and ultimately, He is in control.

We Must Recognize That There Is A Better Place — A Rest

Paul said that to depart from this life and be with Christ was far better (Philippians 1:21). As we live life, we must endure many discomforts

and pains. Paul's understanding of this is evident as he wrote, "For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is working for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory" (2 Corinthians 4:17). Paul speaks of the terrible discomforts of life as being "light afflictions." He describes them as being weighed on a scale; the afflictions in this life would not outweigh the glories to come. In Romans 8:18, Paul says, "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us." Paul is not suggesting that pain and suffering are joyful experiences of life, but living life with a view of heaven, they are overshadowed by the greatness to come. Paul makes this point when he says that the sufferings are "but for a moment" working an "eternal weight of glory." It is imperative to develop this attitude so that we will have the patience to faithfully endure the hardships of this life while anticipating a better place.

We Must Have Confidence in the Promises of God

The life of Paul was indeed a life of faith and confidence in the promises of God. In 2 Corinthians 5:1, Paul says, "we have a building of God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens." Paul did not say, "we might have." What faith and confidence that Paul exhibited in his life. He lived knowing that if his life was taken from him at any moment, there was a place reserved for him. Why? It is because God had promised that there is a place (John 14:1-3; Titus 1:2; Revelation 2:7). Paul lived the promises made to Abraham and the fulfillment of them. Paul lived with the hope of heaven being certain. It is such a pity when those who are Christians live lives that are filled with doubt, despair, and uncertainty. If we are faithful to God, as Paul was, then we can have the same kind of confidence in the promises of God.

May we all develop faith to overcome and endure the pains and sufferings of this life. In doing so, we will live by faith, looking to God's word, obeying Him, doing His will, and placing our lives in the hollow of His hand. Yes, we can live the kind of life that Paul lived is seeing heaven as his goal.

Precious

Everyone possesses things he considers precious. Perhaps they are jewels of great price, family photographs, or even memories that are especially dear. But the Bible speaks of several precious things. Let's consider those things God considers very costly and of great value.

The word of the Lord is Precious

"And the word of the Lord was precious in those days; there was no open vision" (1 Samuel 3:1). The word of Lord is called precious here because it was rare in those days. Is the word of the Lord precious to you in a day and age where most scorn and mock its words? If the word of the Lord is precious to you, you will desire it in order to grow (1 Peter 2:2-3), and you will desire to read and hear and keep its message (Revelation 1:3).

Christ is precious

"...Coming to Him as to a living stone, rejected indeed by men, but chosen by God and precious" (1 Peter 2:4). True, Christ is not precious to all men (1 Peter 2:8), but He is precious to those who believe (1 Peter 2:7). Consider His humble life (Matthew 8:20), His perfect example (1 Peter 2:21), His obedience (Hebrews 5:8-9), and that He is the Savior of the body (Ephesians 5:23).

Precious Blood of Christ

"...Knowing that you were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold, from your aimless conduct received by tradition from your fathers, but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot" (1 Peter 1:18-19). Life is in the blood, and without shedding of blood there is no remission of sins (Hebrews 9:22). The blood of Christ is precious because in it He laid down His perfect life, the only sacrifice that could atone for man's sin. And the only way for the alien sinner to contact that blood, the death of Christ (Romans 5:8-9), for the forgiveness of sin, is through being buried with Him through baptism (Romans 6:1-4). It is Christ's precious blood that cleanses the Christian of his sin when he repents and confesses his sin to God (Acts 8:22).

Precious Faith

"Simon Peter, a servant and apostle of Jesus Christ, to those who have obtained like precious faith with us by the righteousness of our God and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 2:1). Have you heard and obeyed that one faith? (Ephesians 4:4)

Precious Promises

"...By which have been given to us exceedingly great and precious promises, that through these you may be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust." God has given many promises to the Christian, including all spiritual blessings in Christ (Ephesians 1:3) and the promise of eternal life (Revelation 2:10). But to the disobedient there is only the promise of punishment and wrath to come. Are you a Christian and resting in the assurance of his promises?

Precious Deaths

"Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His saints" (Psalm 116:15). Saints are simply Christians (1 Corinthians 1:1-2). The death of one who is not in Christ is a sad occasion. But the death of the Christian is a precious thing in God's eyes, and while those who remain may sorrow, their sorrow is accompanied by hope.

Are these things precious to you? Jesus said, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21).
