Understanding The Bible Alike

“Therefore do not be unwise, but understand what the will of the Lord is” — (Ephesians 5:17).

The apostle Paul believed the scriptures could be understood from what he told the Ephesians. Often, people seem to think that the word of God cannot be understood. Because of this thought, they fail to read the scriptures and study them for themselves. The belief that the word of God cannot be understood will cause people to be indifferent as to what it teaches and will pique little, if any, interest to them. This is tragic because the scriptures are opening to us the will of God. The eternal destiny of man depends upon putting into our lives the principles God expects of us, which He has revealed to us in the scriptures. Let us consider the fact that God’s word can be understood.

We Can Understand It.

The scriptures clearly state that the word of God is intended for everyone and can be understood. Paul writes, “Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in wisdom...” (Colossians 3:16). Paul told the Romans, “whatever things were written before were written for our learning” (Romans 15:4). Paul charged all the Thessalonians to read his letter to them (1 Thessalonians 5:27). Peter admonished, “as newborn babes, desire the pure milk of the word, that you may grow thereby” (1 Peter 2:2). We could go on with more examples, but these statements are enough to show that the scriptures were intended for all people. Evidently, God expects each one to be able to understand His will for them.

We Can Understand The Scriptures Alike.

Some will grant that we can understand the Bible, but they will raise the question, “Can the Bible be seen alike or does it depend upon each individual’s interpretation?” It is clearly seen in the New Testament that people living in the first century understood the teaching they received alike. Phrases such as “all that believed were together (Acts 2:44); “singleness of heart” (Acts 2:47); “multitude of them that believed were of one heart and of one soul” (Acts 4:32). If they understood it alike, God

expects us to also. So why can some read the Bible and see one thing, and others read it and see another thing? It is not a failure of God to give us a revelation that can be understood. Rather, it is our misunderstanding of what God has revealed. It is not that we understand it differently. Why is this the case? The Bible is very evident concerning the unity that should exist among those who profess to be Christians. In John 17:20-21, in Christ's prayer for his disciples, "I do not pray for these alone, but also for those who will believe in Me through their word; that they all may be one in Us, that the world may believe that You sent Me." Jesus prayed that His disciples and those taught by the word, by them, would be one. The unity Christ prayed for is commanded of those that follow Christ. Paul told the Corinthians to have the same mind and the same judgment (1 Corinthians 1:10). To the Philippians, Paul wrote, "...let us walk by the same rule, let us be of the same mind" (Philippians 3:16). We can understand the Bible alike, just as those in the first century seeing we have the same teachings; God's Word, the Bible.

Living With the Divine Rule of Our Life.

The Christians in the first century were united as they were taught the word of God and understood God's will for their lives. If the teaching of the apostles in the first century produced the kind of faith needed to be saved and the things that pleased God, why can we not use the same divine standard and rule today? If we want to please God, that is what we must do. The only rule for our lives must be the word of God. What is taught in the Bible is very important. We must not look at God's word as a cafeteria-style rule, take what we want on one thing and leave behind what we do not like. The Bible is important because it teaches us "all things that pertain to life and godliness" (2 Peter 1:3). The Bible is God's inspired revelation to man, teaching what one must do to be faithful and pleasing to God (2 Timothy 3:16-17; Titus 2:15). The apostle Paul made it clear to the Galatians that they should be able to understand the gospel that was taught and be able to recognize error, when it was taught (Galatians 1:6-9). Recognizing truth and error implies that the word of God can and must be understood alike.

Since the Bible can be understood alike, one should heed the exhortation of Paul to "Be diligent to present yourself approved to God...rightly dividing the word of truth" (2 Timothy 2:15). In doing this, one will be able to "speak as the oracles of God" (1 Peter 4:11). We

should not add anything to or take anything away from the word of God (Revelation 22:18). May all recognize that when the divine rule is followed, there will be no division and we will understand the Bible alike!



Letting Go

"And a man shall leave his father and mother..."

Though the above quote from Genesis 2:24 is written in the context of marriage, it assumes the necessity of children leaving their parents and establishing their own lives. This is not to say parents no longer have any influence over their lives; simply that that influence is diminished. To paraphrase John the Immerser, they increase while their parents decrease.

The painful truth of parenting is we raise our children to let them go. If you think about it, this ultimate goal of God for those children He has entrusted to us is really counter to everything we have done! We love, protect, and guide them over the course of 18+ years; we wake them up, get them ready, check on them at night, watch who their friends are, make sure they are eating right, that they brush their teeth, eat their vegetables, clean their rooms, bandage their skinned knees, doctor their ills, comfort their sorrows, etc. All these actions and more entwine our lives together closer and closer.

Yet, there comes a time God expects us to let them go—to send them out into the world. How could God require such a thing? Does He not understand how frightening of a prospect and how emotionally painful this is?

God knows letting go is necessary. At some point, training wheels must come off and our children must decide for themselves what they will value in life. They must discover who they will be. They cannot do that while under the wings of their parents. Children need to be let go. To some degree, the faith of a child is imposed on them. But, saving faith is not imposed; rather, it is chosen and embraced.

God understands this first hand. After giving instruction through the Law of Moses and giving them Canaan, God let the children of Israel go. "Choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve..." (Joshua 24:15). Deuteronomy is another great text on the necessity of God's children needing to choose. The constant story of the Bible is that of a Father expressing His love, instructing His children, then "sending them off" to decide if they will honor Him and His guidance. Many did and do; many didn't and don't.

In the same way, as parents we do what we can for 18+ years, then let them (hopefully) put into practice what we have taught them. In reality, the letting go is most of the time not a one-time action, but more of a letting the rope out slowly until we come to the end of it. We hold our breaths and pray with each decision that they make. We hurt when they choose poorly; we delight when they choose properly. But, we must let them go, for they cannot truly find God unless they find Him for themselves. This is God's plan.
