# Paul's Answers To Not Losing Heart

"Therefore we do not lose heart. Even though our outward man is perishing, yet the inward man is being renewed day by day. For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is working for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory, while we do not look at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen. For the things which are seen are temporary, but the things which are not seen are eternal"—(2 Corinthians 4:16-18).

We live in a world that is filled with uneasiness and conflict. The news is riddled with tragedy, war, violence, and a mindset that is a tremendous moral shift away from God. Even in churches, we see a trend toward us and less about God. Times like this bring on great consternation about the future. In addition to these things, we bear personal burdens concerning struggles of the health of self, or in the family, issues of the home and our providing the things we need, and the list could go on. The point is many things are difficult and can cause us to lose heart. Paul instructs us to not lose heart. Many may say, "How can I not lose heart living in times like these?" Yes, these times can seem overwhelming and full of discouragement, but Paul answers how we can not lose heart.

#### Remember the Outward and Inward Sides of Man

We do not lose heart when we remember that we are facing a present affliction. We know that the outward man is wasting away. The outer man will not exist forever, and it will return to the dust, but the inner man, the spirit, will return to God (Ecclesiastes 12). Knowing that is the case, we focus on the inside, where the real treasure of our life resides. While the outer man grows older and faces obstacles to happiness in this life, we know that the inner man is being "renewed day by day." Since that is the case, we turn our focus toward God and His rule and reign in our lives and do not allow our lives to lose heart.

#### Remember, The Present Affliction Prepares Us For Glory.

The present afflictions of life may bring tremendous pressures that will bear upon us. Still, we understand that eternal glory is what is in our

future. Paul said, "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us" (Romans 8:18). Paul does not discount the afflictions as being real because pains and trials in life are real. However, the afflictions we face must be seen in what we, as children of God, have in front of us; heaven, at home with God, free from all trials and tribulations of life.

#### Remember to See the Unseen

In the world, we see all the conflict, discouragement, and pressure to conform to what we see. Paul reminds us to live seeing the unseen. Things are not as they appear. The glitter of gold will tarnish with time, so look beyond what you can see with the physical eye to the unseen things, the things seen by faith. Paul reminds us that the unseen things are the eternal things that will never perish. Let us remember to always focus on the unseen things.

Can we remember the valuable answers Paul gives to help us not to lose heart? Yes, we can. Let us keep our hearts focused on God and what we have in our future.

### "Hear Ye Him"

"While he was yet speaking, behold, a bright cloud overshadowed them: and behold, a voice out of the cloud, saying, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased; hear ye him." (Matthew 17:5)

This text provides the answer God gave from heaven when mankind in the person of the apostle Peter thought his idea would be pertinent in the midst of a miraculous lesson being taught.

Difficulties listening to God rather than man goes back a long way in our history. Certainly Adam and Eve listened to the thoughts of Satan and viewed them as greater than the words God had spoken. Noah preached of the impending judgment upon mankind as the wrath of God would bring the great flood on the earth, yet no

one listened to God's word then either. The children of Israel pleaded with Moses to receive the words of God and then relay them to the people to avoid hearing His powerful voice speak directly to them at Mount Sinai.

It seems there is always some aversion to hearing God's message. And it appears it is because there are responsibilities that prevent us from doing what we choose.

In our formative years there were always layers of authority that determined what voice we listened to and obeyed. There were our parents, the school administrators and yes even officers of the law. Each had their own specific area of life in which their authority was supreme. In our home our father was the final arbiter of what was right or wrong for us to do. What was enlightening was how he determined those things. He first consulted God's word in the planning and organization of our lives. But while God was the supreme authority, he recognized authority that God has given to man and we were expected to respect it also.

He taught us that very form of reasoning and even was clear in teaching us that if those in authority in civil matters in life ever called upon us to violate what God demanded of us, we were to listen to God as the supreme authority.

Now most brethren and even folks who have no relationship with God understand the hierarchy. But that authority is often disregarded at any level, civil, criminal or spiritual when it calls for us to deny ourselves and obey the authority.

The discipline required to obey the Lord in Matthew 16:24,25 is very difficult to achieve if indeed we are not desirous of "winning the race" (1 Corinthians 9:24-27) Until we can truly desire that which is spiritual above that which is earthly, fleshly and of course temporal, we cannot be consistent in hearing the message of God.

The only way we will hear Him instead of the voices speaking to our fleshly interests is when we truly begin to long for and look to those things above rather than those things here below (Colossians 3:1-4).

One final point and plea to you who would truly seek the Lord and His interests. There are going to be many opportunities to worship with brethren near you as gospel meetings come along this time of year. Avail yourself of such a spiritual feast as will be offered in each of those occasions. Discipline yourself for the spiritual

exercise demanded to strengthen and sustain your soul.

If you truly love the Lord your God with all your heart and soul and mind, this will be your pleasure.
