What About Division?

"Now I plead with you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment"— (1 Corinthians 1:10).

Paul wrote to the church at Corinth about the problems they were having, telling them that there should be no divisions among them. The issues at Corinth stemmed from the fact that the brethren were claiming allegiance to men. Some would say, "I am of Paul," while others claim to be of Apollos or Cephas." Yet, some would say, "I am of Christ." Paul asked, "Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul?" (1 Corinthians 1:12-13). It is the division of these people that professed to be followers of Christ that Paul admonished them. Let's consider the question, what about division.

Division Among God's People is Wrong.

The dividing of those professing to be Christians into different groups and giving themselves different names is condemned in scripture and not pleasing to God. The night before Jesus was crucified, He prayed for the unity of His disciples. Jesus prayed, saying, "I do not pray for these alone, but also for those who will believe in Me through their word; that they all may be one, as You, Father, are in me, and I in You; that they also may be one in Us, that the world may believe that You sent Me" (John 17:20-21). Jesus' desire was for all believers in Him to be one, not many splinter groups teaching many different doctrines. Paul encouraged the Ephesians to endeavor "to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called in one hope of your calling; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all" (Ephesians 4:3-6). God's people are to be one and of the same mind and judgment.

The Plan for Unity is in the Body.

In Ephesians 4, Paul first mentioned that there is "one body." We must remember that the body Paul is talking about is the church. Paul

made this clear early in this epistle when he wrote concerning the authority of Christ and said, "He put all things under His feet, and gave Him to be head over all things to the church, which is His body, the fulness of Him who fills all in all" (Ephesians 1:22-23). The unity that God expects and demands is a unity founded upon the authority of Christ. God has not approved of various religious bodies or denominations which compose the universal church. The body or the Lord's church is composed of all Christians from all times (Hebrews 12:23). The church is not given an earthly hierarchy with a headquarters on earth. Christ is the head of the church (Colossians 1:18; Ephesians 1:22-23). Individuals make up the body as they are "baptized into one body" (1 Corinthians 12:13, 27). In Acts 2, the Scriptures teach that when one obeys the gospel of Christ, they are added by the Lord to the church or the body (Acts 2:37-47). After becoming a Christian, we are to find a group of people following the divine pattern God has given for worship and work to join ourselves in that local congregation (Acts 9:17-18, 26). These local congregations are not a denomination. They are independent, autonomous groups following the divine pattern in the Scriptures. They are not tied together by any human organizations, such as headquarters, councils, synods, or societies to other congregations. The head is Christ, and it is from His word we receive instructions for our faith and practice (Colossians 1:18; Romans 10:17). As Christians come together to form a local church, they are not becoming a "Church of Christ" denomination, but a church whose devotion is to Christ and His cause.

Let us recognize that by having membership in a denomination, the implication is that we advocate division and separation into religious denominations. We find no evidence in the New Testament of the practice or acceptance of denominationalism. Instead, the New Testament clearly condemns division. Therefore, denominationalism is not a part of God's plan and is wrong and should be rejected by those that claim to be followers of Christ.

What Noah Built

Our society has a fascination for Noah and the ark he built. Little Noah figurines and little arks with animals going in two by two are often seen in stores. Noah's building of the ark was surely a great feat even by today's engineering standards. Imagine a vessel in that day and time 150 yards long, 25 yards wide and 15 yards high. What an ark!! But Noah built something even more impressive than that. Noah built a faithful family in a tremendously wicked world.

Perhaps we sometimes look at the wickedness of our world and wonder if we can really bring up a godly family. How will we ever get our children past the vulgarities, lewdness, sexual immorality, drunkenness, drugs and the allurements of material things. Can it be done? Yes! Noah did it and did it in a world where there were hardly enough adjectives to describe how bad it was. Look at God's description. "Then the Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually" (Genesis 6:5). Imagine Noah, the preacher of righteousness (2 Peter 2:5), teaching his family God's ways and steering them over the tides of wickedness. It could be done then. It can be done now. Noah knew it began with him (Genesis 6:9). A father cannot lead his family into something he is not.

Noah's family thought little details mattered when it came to God. They didn't try as some do today to distinguish between what really matters in God's word and what doesn't. All God's commands have His breath on them (2 Timothy 3:16-17). They knew they all mattered. They sought to do everything just as God had told them. From the measurements of the ark to the gathering of the right number of animals, they did it just as God said (Genesis 6:22). God's patterns mattered to them. They should matter to us.

Here too was a family that waited for the new world. Can't you imagine it had to be easy to get restless on the ark. How many stops do we make on a vacation trip to just get out, stretch our legs and do something different for a while. They were on this ark for one year and ten days with a huge company of animals. Whew!! Maybe they wondered, "When will this ever be over?" But they

waited on God's promise of a new world to come. God's people still have to do that. We must imitate families like Noah's who "through faith and patience inherit the promises" (Hebrews 6:12)

Noah's family was worshipful. After the flood was over, their first act was to worship God. Noah built an altar and offered sacrifices unto God (Genesis 8:20-21). How sweet it smelled to God. The old world of corruption was gone and things are beginning anew with a single solitary family worshipping Him. Never let us underestimate what is being built into the hearts of our children as we lead them to each period of worship. Let us wake them with a "Time to wake up children. We get to worship God today." It's our privilege, not a burdensome ritual.

Noah's family paved the way for comfort and rest. Noah's father, Lamech, had hoped his son could make a difference. He hoped Noah could bring comfort to all our toil (Genesis 5:29). Maybe he had other ideas in mind but Noah surely played a part in bringing us comfort. Thousands of years later, a child was born. Jesus was His name. Who can't help but smile as we read of his bloodline genealogy through Mary. It ends saying, "the son of Shem, the son of Noah" (Luke3:36). What comfort Jesus brings. "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light" (Matt. 11:28-30).

Building the ark may have been the easier task for Noah. Building a faithful family just might be the hardest job on the planet. Maybe that's why so many "throw in the towel." They just give up on it. Don't ever give up. Trust in God. Be faithful to Him. We too can be godly in perilous times.
