"For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." — (Romans 6:23)

Paul tells us that sin pays the wages of death and separation from God, but God paid the debt so we can live. A song we sing says,

> "He paid a debt He did not owe, I owed a debt I could not pay, I needed someone to wash my sins away. And now I sing a brand new song, "Amazing Grace." All day long. Christ Jesus paid the debt that I could never pay."

What a blessed thought, that Jesus, God in the flesh, would come to this earth and live a perfect life and give His life on the cross as a ransom for my sins (Philippians 2:5-8; Matthew 20:28). But what is required of me, since Jesus paid it all?

Jesus Expects My Total Commitment.

When a lawyer asked Jesus, what is the law's greatest commandment? Jesus replied: "love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind" (Matthew 22:37). It is clear Jesus expects us to give ourselves entirely to Him. As another song says, "All to Him I owe." Yes, we owe Jesus everything. Paul was a prime example of one that surrendered his life to the will of Christ in all things. In many cases, the choices Paul had to make were very tough, but his concern was to please Jesus, the one who had "paid

it all" for him. In Philippians 3, as Paul is mentioning things about his life, the prominent position that he had among the Jews in the religion that he had been raised in said, "But what things were gain to me, these I have counted loss for Christ. The Consequences of Doing Nothing

Matthew 25 records three judgment day scenes. The parable of the wise and foolish virgins (vv. 1 -13), the parable of the talents (vv. 14-30) and the description of the Lord separating the nations as a shepherd dividing sheep from goats (vv. 31-46) are all about judgment.

Notice that in each case, either some person or group of persons is rejected by the Lord. Also notice that in each instance, those rejected by the Lord are not condemned for doing something wrong— but rather for failing to do what was right.

The five foolish virgins were not excluded from the wedding because they were liars or fornicators, but because they failed to make preparation for the arrival of the bridegroom (the Lord). The one talent man was not judged for stealing or extortion, but for failing to use what the Lord had entrusted to him. Those called "goats" by the Lord were banished from His presence not because they assaulted or insulted the poor, but for failing to do good to them. They simply ignored their plight and rendered no aid whatsoever.

When you consider your service to God, do you find yourself thinking only of all the things you do not do? Of course, Christians must "abstain from every form of evil"(1 Thessalonians 5:22, NKJV) — but they must also be "zealous for good works" (Titus 2:14, NKJV). After all, failing to do what is right is just as sinful as doing what we know is wrong (James 4:17). While those who fail to know God (1 John 2:3-4) and who fail to obey the gospel will also fail to enter heaven (2 Thessalonians 1:7-9) — the saved can look forward to being welcomed to Paradise with the words, "Well done, you good and faithful servant..." (Matthew 25:21).

It is essential to remember, however, that Jesus cannot say "well done" to people who have not done anything at all!
