## Teaching Them To Observe

"Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20)

In this text, Jesus is giving the great commission. The great commission proclaims the great news of salvation to the world lost in sin. Indeed, we all ought to proclaim the story of Jesus to all men of all nations. We should do everything we can to teach them and convert them from a life of darkness and sin to a life of light and hope. However, even when we have instructed, converted, and seen people baptized, we have only seen the birth of a child of God. There is great joy in the new birth of a child of God, but there is still more that Jesus expects for those heeding His great commission. Jesus says we are to teach "them to observe all things that I have commanded you." The growth of the Christian is something that Jesus is concerned about as He tells the disciples to teach those they baptize to observe all things.

## Christianity Is Not A One-Time Decision

We must understand that Christianity is not just a one-time decision made, and then it is over. Being a Christian involves a lifetime of growth. The Christian is a child of God and a part of the family of God. The family analogy gives us the picture of brothers and sisters, children, and parents. God is the Father. As the Father, He provides for us as His children. We are children of God because we have voluntarily submitted ourselves to Him and have been baptized into Christ (Galatians 3:26-27). By being baptized into Christ, we have been "born again" into the family of God or the church (John 3:3-5). The ones that have been "born again" are new converts or "babes in Christ." Peter speaking of the new birth, says, "being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God" (1 Peter 1:23). Peter continues to speak of the laying aside of old dispositions, attitudes, and actions of sin. Peter says we should "as newborn babes desire the sincere milk of the word that ye may grow"

(1 Peter 2:1-2). The new convert's description is as a "babe," and growth is what God desires and expects.

## The Growth of the Christian

The scriptures are clear that Christians are to grow.

- The newborn babe will die if they do not receive spiritual nurturing. Everyone understands the tragedy of a baby born in this physical life left alone, uncared for, and deserted. The scriptures teach pure and undefiled religion to God and will not allow a child to be uncared-for (James 1:27). Disciples, who follow the instruction of Jesus in the great commission, will not allow this to happen in those who are born in Christ.
- The teaching of God's word and the grounding of newborn babes/new converts is vital in the maturity and growth of the child of God. Speaking to Christians that had obeyed the gospel sometime earlier, the Hebrew writer says, "For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you again the first principles of the oracles of God; and you have come to need milk, and not solid food. For everyone who partakes only of milk is unskilled in the word of righteousness, for he is a babe. But solid food belongs to those who are of full age, that is, those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil" (Hebrews 5:12-14).
- Paul, writes to the Ephesians concerning the growth of Christians, saying, "...that we should no longer be children, tossed to and fro and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, in the cunning craftiness of deceitful plotting, but speaking the truth in love, may grow up in all things into Him who is the head—Christ" (Ephesians 4:14-15).
- Peter admonishes the Christians as he closes his epistle, "But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 3:18).

It is evident in the scriptures that Jesus and the apostles taught that Christians should grow. Without growth and maturity, Christians will go aimlessly through life and fall prey to the devil's snares. The trials and temptations will come to man. Still, with faith in what life is all about, going to heaven when you die, a Christian will endure (2 Timothy 4:8). Jesus came and gave his life to save man, and spiritual growth and development are essential for Christians not to grow weary and fall away.

Indeed, we can understand why Jesus stressed the growth of new converts in his teaching during His mi-

nistry and reminded the disciples of this just before He ascended to the Father. Growing in faith is imperative if we are to endure to the end. Let us work to increase our faith and to teach others to grow and observe all things.
