"You Must Be Born Again"

"Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again" — (John 3:5-6).

Jesus, speaking to Nicodemus, said, "unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God" (John 3:3). Jesus continued to explain the new birth and declared to him, "You must be born again" (John 3:6). It is obvious that the reference to "water and the Spirit" refers to baptism. Also, Jesus, in this passage, shows the necessity of the spiritual birth for one to enter the kingdom of God. Let us examine what the scriptures teach us about baptism being a new birth.

What Is the Role of the Spirit?

The Spirit is involved in the revelation of God's will to man through the word of God, which produces faith (Romans 10:17). Jesus promised His disciples that the Spirit would come and guide them into all truth (John 16:13). The Spirit would bring to their minds all that Jesus had taught them. So, as the disciples preached and wrote, the Spirit guided them in revealing God's will to man (1 Corinthians 2:13). As the people heard the teaching of God, they were convicted of their sins and were baptized to have their sins forgiven (Acts 2:38; 3:19; 22:16). With their sins washed away they were pure as now newborn babes.

Paul Speaks of the Newness of Life.

Paul tells the Galatian Christians that their baptism resulted from their faith in Christ. Hearing the will of God brought them to have faith and led them to put on Christ by being baptized (Galatians 3:26-27). In putting on Christ, the scriptures speak of being a new man.

- In 2 Corinthians 5:17, Paul writes, "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation."
- Paul, writing to the Romans about their baptism into Christ, says baptism is a burial of the old man, and they were raised to "walk in newness of life" (Romans 6:3-6).

 In Ephesians 4:24, Paul writes, "put on the new man, which is created according to God, in righteousness and true holiness."

The New Man Is A Changed Man.

The new man or the newness of life is not just the same person who is baptized and now attends worship services. Instead, he is changed, living with a different direction, feelings, goals, and desires for his life. Paul expressed this change in his life when he wrote to the church at Philippi in Philippians 3. "But what things were gain to me, these I have counted loss for Christ. Yet indeed I also count all things loss for the excellence of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them as rubbish, that I may gain Christ...that I may know Him and the power of the resurrection, and the fellowship of His sufferings, being confrormed to His death, if, by any means, I amy attain to the resurrection from the dead. Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended; but one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead, I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 3:7-8, 10, 13-14). Paul mentions as a new creature, his direction of life changed after being baptized and crucifying the old man. As a new man, his goals and desires are focused on Christ. After the new birth, the new man will not conform to the world but will be living a righteous, holy life and conforming to the image of God.

The new birth is essential; it causes people to change their lives so that they might receive the crown that awaits the faithful (2 Timothy 4:8; Revelation 2:10). If one is not born again by obeying the command to be baptized, he will die in his sins and hear the Lord say, "depart from Me, you cursed, into everlasting fire prepared for the devil and his angels" (Matthew 25:41). Do not let that be you!

Superficial Standards

King Saul, Israel's first king, was "handsome" and tall and looked kingly. Yet, he did not act like God's king. Later, God would anoint a shepherd boy, David, and say, "Do not look at his appearance or his physical stature...for the Lord does not see as man sees; for man looks at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart" (1 Samuel 16:7). It's not that David was ugly, but God chose him on the basis of his "heart" and not on the basis of his looks, his pedigree, or his seniority in the family (he had older brothers). David was far more successful than Saul and one of the keys to his success was he was "a man after God's own heart" (1 Samuel 13:14).

Sometimes single folks date someone because they are beautiful or rich. We love to hear people say we "look like a cute couple." But, really, how shallow if looks are the only thing that make us attractive! Proverbs warns the young man, "As a ring of gold in a swine's snout, so is a lovely woman who lacks discretion" (11:22). We need to look deeper than a person's flesh and wallet or purse before we commit to a lifetime. Samson could be the Bible's "Exhibit A" of the foolishness of looking at a person's face without considering their faith (Judges 14:1-3). As Proverbs 15:16 says, "Better is a little with the fear of the Lord, than great treasure with trouble." Think about the heart.

Sometimes we search for a preacher on the basis of his looks, his family, his eloquence, his flashy style. Yet, these are never standards of success for God's soldiers. Timothy was told to look for "faithful men who will be able to teach others also" (2 Timothy 2:2). God wants his preachers to have hearts filled with His word, inflamed to share it, and doing so with love. What do his actions say about his heart? Quit looking for just a "pulpit guy" who plays golf every day and look for someone who greets the visitors warmly, takes time to talk to the kids, makes time for the widow, and sacrifices to serve others. Jesus did not tell his disciples the key to preaching success was in tailored suits, Toastmasters clubs, and their preaching prowess. He said, "whosoever would become great among you shall be your servant" (Matthew 20:26).

Let's be careful to avoid creating superficial standards for those who will serve important roles in our lives. Are we looking through God's eyes as we see others?
