"Draw Near To God"

"Therefore submit to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you. Draw near to God and He will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners; and purify your hearts, you doubleminded." – (James 4:8).

James writes, reminding that followers of Christ will submit to God. The one who allows God to rule in their life will resist the devil and his onslaught. But to submit to God involves more than saying "no" to Satan; it involves drawing nearer to God. Resisting the devil will cause him to flee from you, but if we do not draw near to God, the devil will come with more advances to trap us. Therefore, James adds that we must also "Draw near to God." Indeed, we need a strong relationship with the Lord so that when the times of temptation come, and yes, they will come, we can rely on the strength of the Lord. Let me suggest four things to help us draw nearer to God and bolster our relationship with Him.

- 1. Take Time to Pray. To draw closer to God, one must give more time in prayer to God. Jesus taught that "men ought always to pray" (Luke 18:1). Prayer does not just happen. Each one must be determined to make an effort and to take the time to pray. As one prays, he draws closer to God. Prayer is essential if one is to remain close to God.
- 2. Read and Study God's Word. Drawing closer to God will require that one spend time reading and studying the word of God. As we get to know the mind of our Father in heaven, it will help us to be more like Him. The world does not give us this standard, but the word of God provides us with the standard and reveals the mind of God to us (John 12:48; 1 Corinthians 2:9-16). When we draw closer to God, the necessary virtues will be added to our lives (2 Peter 1:5-7). The qualities mentioned here will replace the problems that hinder spiritual growth, such as selfishness, worldliness, and a lack of commitment.
- 3. Submit to God. As we read the scriptures, let us submit ourselves to the ways of God. When you submit to God, you will resist the devil, and we can draw near to God. Submitting to God then is not

passive but active. It is not just stating, "I believe," but actively living your faith.

Grow in Faith and Service. The growth of faith 4. does not just happen; we must advance it. If we are to grow in faith and service, one thing that we must do is to be present and involved in the assemblies of the church. The Hebrew writer is encouraging Christians to grow in faith and service. In Hebrews 10:24-25 he tells them, "to consider one another so as to stir up love and good works, not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together..., but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the day approaching." The writer connects the growth of faith and service to our assembling together. We must understand the value in study, prayer, teaching in song, giving and reflecting upon God's will, and His marvelous grace has upon my life, causing me to be drawn nearer to God.

Let us each resolve to draw closer to God and encourage those around us to do the same.

Saints In A Strange Setting

Sometimes the hard circumstances in life cause some Christians to grow tired of living the life God demands; their despair leads them to give up all together.

Persecution, peer pressure, lack of faith, opposition from family, etc., can cause some Christians to think it is impossible to fight the good fight and remain faithful. This problem is not new. Christians of the 1st century were plagued with the same obstacles Christians in the 21st century face.

Consider the Christians at Philippi. In Philippians, Paul says that you can be a Christian regardless of the circumstances in life. "Salute every saint in Christ Jesus. The brethren that are with me salute you. All the saints salute you, especially they that are of Caesar's household. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit" (4:21-23). Saints are people set apart to the Lord. With faith in Christ and His word, the Christians at Philippi demonstrated this. Roman Caesars were not known for their spirituality. Nero was an avowed enemy of Christ and His church. Yet, the Christians in Caesar's household were able to remain faithful; they even demonstrated love and concern for those in other places.

Another example of someone who stood alone is Joseph. At the hand of ungodly brothers, Joseph was sold into Egyptian slavery; he was forced to serve people who had only contempt for the God of heaven. An ungodly woman sought to lead Joseph into sin. He suffered doing right. But Joseph did not lose God's respect!

What about the three Hebrew boys who were thrown into the fiery furnace? Surely they had the right to say: "Well, everybody else is doing it!" Remember Daniel who faced certain death in the lion's den. He stood and faced the crowd with "open windows."

There are saints in Caesar's household today. In the home relationship only one mate is faithful to God and faces an uphill battle to remain faithful. Often ungodly companions present strong pressures to give up. Paul believed that women could be faithful despite their unfavorable circumstances (1 Corinthians 7:12-14). Peter says that godly wives can use their influence to convert their husbands (1 Peter 3:1-3). Christians work with those who curse and swear. The pressure to drink alcohol is strong. But many withstand this type of pressure. Men and women in military service are exposed to many temptations. Cornelius was a military man and was also dedicated to God. Young people are tempted to conform. Pressure of peers to dance, engage in drug abuse, and illicit relationships is strong.

Remember: "Let no man despise thy youth; but be thou an ensample to them that believe, in word, in manner of life, in love, in faith, in purity" (1 Timothy 4:12).

We can do right if the determination is strong enough. "I can do all things in Him who strengthens me." ~via *Lenexa Edifer*; Lenexa, Kansas.
