

## *The Strength to Say “No”*

*“Teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously and godly in the present age.” – (Titus 2:12)*

In our day and age, people have a real problem saying “No.” In the early 1980s, Nancy Reagan, First Lady of the United States, learning the prevalence of drug and alcohol abuse, launched a campaign called “Just Say No.” The problem of not saying “no” is perpetuated by parents when they raise their children and do not teach them what “No” means. The scriptures teach that there are times when we must say “No.” In “denying ungodliness and worldly lusts” (Titus 2:12), each of us must be able to say “no” at times to be pleasing to God.

### Denying Ungodliness and Worldly Lusts

It is a foolish person who gives his life over to the things of the world and its lusts. God’s grace will save man, but only if we learn to say “no” to sin. In Romans 6:1, Paul asks, “Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound?” He answers his own question in verse 2, “Certainly not!” Paul stresses to the Romans that we must say no to sin. Paul wrote to the Corinthians, “Do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived. Neither fornicators, nor idolators, nor adulterers, nor homosexuals, nor sodomites, nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners will inherit the kingdom of God” (1 Corinthians 6:9-11). Notice that the unrighteous (ungodly) will not be saved. Why? Because they failed to say “no” to the various sins that are listed by Paul. The grace of God brings salvation to all men, but only those that live according to the teaching of God’s will and say “no” to evil.

### How Can We Have Strength to Say “No”?

The strength to say “no” to the lusts of the world is found in the attitude of living “soberly, righteously and godly” (Titus 2:12). To live soberly means to live a self-controlled life. Righteously means living upright, which will cause our lives to be godly, focusing on the eternal things rather than the temporary ones. Strength in our lives comes when

we give ourselves to things that cause our faith to be strong: reading, studying, and meditating upon the word of God. Praying for wisdom and strength to face the things of life is essential.

The grace of God has come to man that all can be saved, but do not think that means all will be saved. The rich man in Luke 12:16-21 lived his life for himself. We must understand that God gave His Son so that we might be saved and that we must give our lives to righteousness and godliness if we are to be saved. Therefore, let us live our lives recognizing that what we do and how we live will determine where we will spend our eternity.



## *God Is, Therefore...*

Listen carefully to 1 John 4:7-12:

“Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love. In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us and his love is perfected in us.”

The Holy Spirit makes it very clear. “God is...” and who God is must be reflected by His people—in our minds, speech, lives, actions, interactions, reactions, and worship.

- God is merciful and that mercy should be seen in us.
- God is faithful and so ought we to be faithful.
- God is good and He has called us to be reflectors of His goodness into His world.

- God is patient with us and expects us to be patient with others.
- God should be imitated by His people—like father, like child.

“Love is from God,” John writes. Love is not from the world, a dictionary, movies, or the media. “Love is from God” and the most powerful evidence of His love is that He “sent His only Son into the world, so that we might live through Him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins.”

And where does this line of thought take us? “If God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.” Like father, like child.

Corinthians 9:14, 16:1-2, John 4:24, Colossians 3:16, Philippians 1:1, 1 Timothy 3:1-13, etc.).

One may think 'Does it matter?' is directed to each of us – but that's not entirely true. In fact, these things do not matter to most people. But they matter to God – and so they should matter to you!


