Counting It All Joy

"My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience. But let patience have its perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing" – (James 1:2-4)

James is writing his letter to encourage Christians to bear patiently through their trials and help them understand the correct response. James uses the word "when" to speak of trials to come. James' point is that life will involve trials, troubles, or difficulties. However, as humans, we do not want to believe it. We somehow want to believe troubles or trials will not come, but the truth is affirmed here: troubles will come. Everyone will not have the same trials as someone else, but they are trials, and we must endure them, counting it all joy. How can we do that?

Change Your Focus

In life, we are constantly bombarded with "you need something," if we are not careful, we can fall into believing it. The world tells us we need money, fame, fortune, sex, cars, or all kinds of gadgets to be happy. However, as disciples, we must realize that Jesus did not teach that happiness, comfort, and peace are found in the things of life. We cannot build our lives on physical things and find enduring joy (Matthew 6). At best, it will give us momentary satisfaction, but then we will need more to keep us happy. So, as disciples of Christ, we need to change our focus in life. Instead of focusing on the things the world offers us, we need to strive for the focus Jesus shows to us. We need to fix our eyes on Jesus and see the joy He reveals to us as He does the Father's will (Hebrews 12:2-3).

Have Patience Through the Trials

James writes, "But let patience..." Patience is sometimes translated as "perseverance" or "steadfastness." James continues to show how the testing of your faith produces patience." To put it another way, the testing of faith will bring steadfastness to bring you to maturity. Often, people will see the trials in life as failures, and that is precisely what Satan wants us

to believe, but James is telling us trials are not failures but are to bring us to maturity. God does not want His people to see themselves as failures or victims, but rather an attitude of victory. Remember, the Lord responded to Paul when he suffered a trial in life, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness." Paul responds, "Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities..." (2 Corinthians 12:9). Let us have the patience and perseverance to deal with our trials to glorify Christ.

As the disciples of Christ, let us understand our purpose in this life. The purpose is to show the life of Christ in our lives (Matthew 5:14-16). May we use every day, every situation, and every circumstance to show Christ living in us and how to glorify God.

Faith & Trust

Faith in God must be of such a nature as to cause the one possessing it to rise up and act upon the commandments which God gives him. Anything short of this is not faith. But, faith is more than this. Faith is more than mere obedience to commandments, even though it most surely must encompass this completely. It is in reality absolute trust in God whether in His commands or in every other area of life.

The Bible tells us that, "By faith Sarah herself received power to conceive, even when she was past the age, since she considered him faithful who had promised. Therefore from one man, and him as good as dead, were born descendants as many as the stars of heaven and as many as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore," Hebrews 11:11,12. Nothing is spoken in this text of obedience to God's commands for the simple reason that in these various verses the Hebrew writer does not discuss commands to be obeyed. This was a promise from God, and involved the woman's trust that the one who promised could discharge the promise made. It is

understood that Sarah was a Godly woman who did obey the commands of God under all circumstances.

This serves as a lesson in trust. The subject of faith depends on God to do that which we would find difficult or impossible without His help. Sarah was at the time of the promise of a child, Isaac, ninety years old. Her husband Abraham was 100 years old. No Bible student has trouble accepting the reality that "Abraham and Sarah were past the age of normal childbearing." They would have no normal expectancy of becoming parents. Yet, concerning Sara, God said, "As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her name Sarai, but Sarah shall be her name. I will bless her, and moreover, I will give you a son by her. I will bless her, and she shall become nations; kings of peoples shall come from her," Genesis 17:15-16.

The Hebrew writer looks back upon this event when he comments upon Sarah's faith. Sarah simply believed in, that is, she trusted in God. She trusted Him to do what He promised, even though she could not understand how He would accomplish it.

Modern Christians find themselves in many situations in which we are called upon to exercise much the same faith — trust. Jesus said, "But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you," Matthew 6:33. This is a promise of the Lord. It takes faith to accept it. It takes trust. But, nothing short of that faith or trust can be of any value to the disciple of Christ. This sort of faith was lacked by the Israelites of old when they listened to the spies who gave an unfavorable report concerning the land of Canaan, saying, "We cannot take it!" Joshua and Caleb had the faith — trust — the rest lacked, for they said, "With the Lord's help it can be done," even though by human standards it can never be done. It is that kind of faith which we need when confronted with the responsibilities of life. Jesus assured, such trust will nullify the greater part of all our worries.

It is just absolute trust in God.
